The day is drawing closer when you will have the opportunity of seeing the best team in England. Next Saturday is the great day when we face Manchester United in the Third Round of the Cup. It is going to be a battle of giants. Manchester have no walk over, as they fully realise themselves. On the morning after the draw, one of the Manchester daily papers informed its readers that, "Manchester United would rather play on any other ground in England than West Ham's." What is there wrong with the ground? Nothing! What the paper meant to say was that, "Manchester United would rather meet any other Club in England than West Ham." You will notice that there is really little difference. Manchester have secured 36 points in 26 matches and head the First Division of the League, while West Ham have 32 points for 25 matches, and are fourth in the Southern League.

It is curious that in their away games both Clubs have lost 5 matches, and have each had 15 goals scored against them, while West Ham have scored one goal more away from home than have Manchester. Then in the home matches Manchester have been beaten once and have lost four more goals than we have.

Both Clubs played at home last Saturday, and while we beat Norwich 2—1, Manchester gained a 3—1 victory over Bristol City, one of the lowest clubs in their League. To-day, Manchester are meeting our old friends Newcastle United, on the banks of the Tyne.

The Manchester Directors do not often make changes in their team, and there is every probability that on Saturday next, the Club will be represented by nine of the players that lifted the Cup on April 26th, 1909, at the Crystal Palace when they beat Bristol City 1—0.

It will be seen that there are only two changes this season from the side that won the Cup. Hayes at back, and Turnbull (J.) the centre forward, have left the Club, and now Stacey has Donnelly for partner while West leads the forwards.

To show how fairly regular the team played together last season, I append their appearances:—

Moger 37, Donnelly 8, Hayes 30, Stacey 32, Duckworth 30, Roberts 28, Bell 28, Meredith 31, Halse 27, Turnbull (A.) 28, and Wall 32.

The goalscorers out of this party were:—

Wall 14, Turnbull (A.) 13, Halse 6, Meredith 5, Roberts 4.

West who now leads the forwards was last season with Notts Forest for whom he played in 32 matches and scored 17 goals.

Now for a moment let's look at their past three year's Cup-tie records.—In 1908 they reached the Fourth Round; in 1909 they won the Cup, and it is almost superfluous to add that they were knocked out in the First Round in 1910. But so it was. It was the third consecutive season on which the holders of the trophy fell at the first fence. Burnley playing like demons knocked Manchester United out by 2—0, and afforded the winners some compensation for being unluckily defeated by the United in the Fourth Round in the previous season. On that occasion Burnley were leading when a snowstorm stopped play shortly before time, and Manchester won on the re-play by 3—2.

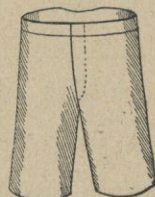
