COMMENTS.

Bristol Rovers are again showing quaint form, but they have made a start good enough to warrant our expectation of a keen struggle to-day. Their first game of the season was at Charlton, and they won by the only goal of the match. Their next game was at home, and Exeter City beat them by the only goal of the game. Then they entertained Gillingham, and won by two goals clear, but visiting Exeter again suffered defeat. Then they travelled to Merthyr and won by the odd goal of five, but went under at Swindon by 2-4, while last Saturday at home they could only draw with Newport County, sharing four goals. How would a student of form arrive at an estimate of the result of the game at Luton in view of the following results? Luton lost at Merthyr, 1-2. Bristol won at Merthyr, 3-2. Luton defeated Newport at Luton, 4-2. Bristol drew with Newport at Bristol, 2-2.

Football is not a game of predictions, though it may be of hope, and after losing three games in succession, not one of which should have been lost, we hope to get on the winning track again to-day.

The changes made in the Town team are in the nature of experiments. The rear-guard remains as last Saturday. Anderson's ankle still prevents him turning out, though one could not say whom he could have displaced. Walker had a very hard game against the Rangers, and so it was decided to rest him this afternoon, and give Neal a further opportunity. The most notable change, however, is in the forward line. The failure to score in three consecutive games has involved hard thinking, and so Reid has been called up again to lead the forward line. He has never quite forgotten that he was originally a centre-forward, and as Jim Thompson has had left wing experience, he has gone to the extreme left in place of Dennis, and the



Welshman substitutes him in the centre. We hope that the change will produce fruit.

The Rovers have seven of last season's men in the side, the four changes being a complete middle line and an inside-left. Crichton was with Bradford last season, and Wilson is a brother of the Huddersfield Town centre-forward. Last year he helped Worcester City to carry off the championship of the Birmingham League. Jones was with Exeter City. Wilcox was formerly with Bristol City, but went to Bradford and thence to New Brighton, for whom last season he scored no fewer than 35 goals in 41 games. That speaks volumes for his chief characteristic.

OCCASIONAL NOTES.

The Football Association have announced that in consequence of the disturbance which took place at the Brentford-Brighton Third League game on September 12th, the Brentford ground has been closed for a fortnight from September 28th, and that Allen, the Brentford forward, who was sent off the field, has been suspended for a month.

This will cause a postponement of the game with Chelsea in the second round of the London Cup fixed for Monday next, and interfere with their local League "Derby" with Crystal Palace on October 3rd. The latter fixture has been reversed, and Brentford will go to Selhurst on that date, the return being played at Brentford on February 13th.

Although numerous rumours were current during the week regarding the transfer and purchase of players by the Blackpool Football Club, it was not until Thursday night that the directors of the Blackpool club agreed upon the transfer of Harry Bedford, their International centre-forward, to Derby County.

The directors of the seaside club decline to state the amount for the fee, but it is understood to be £3,500.

It was no secret that negotiations had been in progress for some time by the seaside club to strengthen their team, particularly for the half-back and forward positions, but it was understood that nothing would be done in the way of transferring any of their present players until their primary object had been achieved.

Bedford, who was born at Chesterfield, went to Blackpool from Nottingham Forest in March, 1921, and during his connection with the seaside team he has established a proud and distinctive record. For two successive seasons he was top scorer in the League, and completed 100 League goals last September. He also played for England against Ireland, and for the League against the Irish League.

Already this season he is the top scorer at Blackpool with six goals. His record for League matches is as follows:—

Nottingham Forest: 1919-20, 3; 1920-21, 5.
Blackpool: 1920-21, 6; 1921-22, 11; 1922-23, 32; 1923-24, 34; 1924-25, 24; 1925-26, 6.




