

## OCCASIONAL NOTES.

When Gillingham came to Luton, R. A. Edmed, their outside right, was the most admired of their very good forward line. He has now been transferred to Liverpool. The transaction was completed after the game with Southend United on Wednesday. The fee is stated to be a record one for a Gillingham player, the amount being a four-figure one. Edmed only came into the Gillingham side last season, but in the present campaign he has displayed consistently good form on the wing. This is the second winger signed on by the Anfield club in recent months, the other being Oxley, from Chesterfield, in November.

In view of the fact that the South Shields—Birmingham Cup-tie will be the only attraction in the north-eastern area on January 30th, the Birmingham management suggested that the match should be played at Sunderland or Newcastle, where there was a prospect of a larger "gate." The South Shields directors, however, have unanimously decided not to entertain this proposal, and the match will be played at Horsley Hill, as previously arranged. As the South Shields ground will only accommodate about 28,000 spectators, it has been decided to increase the stand charges.

No definite decision has yet been arrived at as to whether Brighton and Hove Albion will be able to release their captain, Jenkins, for the Ireland v. Wales International match at Belfast on February 13th. On that day the Albion visit Plymouth, and if any of Brighton's Irish Internationals are also honoured the team will be severely handicapped.

Derby County have signed on as an amateur John Leslie Hart, a centre-forward from Mansfield Town. Hart has scored 40 goals in 15 matches for his club this season. He was with the Chesterfield club for a short period. He is 19 years old, stands 6ft. 1½in. in height, and weighs 12½st.

The Boston United club received a cheque for £574 7s. as their share of the Cup-tie at Roker. In acknowledging receipt, Boston officials express their high appreciation of the treatment received from the Sunderland club. They also requested, when the cheque was returned through the bank, it be sent on to the Boston club, and they would have it framed as a memento of the visit.







There are many flashes of the little star's own particular humour, and she is well supported by Carlye Blackwell. The story opens in London, where Betty's sweetheart, Robert Hewitt, an artist, is convalescing after an illness. Sir Hargrave Wendever, a financier, has been told by doctors that he has only a year to live, and it pleases him as an act of philanthropy to take the two young people with him to Monte Carlo. Monte Carlo reached, Sir Hargrave has to go on a long sea voyage, and during his absence, Senator Trentino, an unscrupulous manipulator of stocks and shares, whom he has definitely set out to ruin, plots to separate the sweethearts. Trentino's ultimate idea is to plant in Hewitt's mind the thought that Sir Hargrave has brought Betty to Monte Carlo for other than philanthropic reasons and to stir him to murder. On Sir Hargrave's return Trentino's plans certainly seem to succeed, and when he tries to shoot Wendever himself there arises a situation in which Betty has to decide whether she will forgive Robert or turn to a true friend in her benefactor.
