## COMMENTS ON THE GAME AND PLAYERS

To-night, if results are according to form, Luton Town should be at the top of the League Table, but so many curious things happen in football that one cannot rely on form study.

It is the game itself that counts, not what has gone before. On Merthyr Town's record Luton should win, but nine out of ten people must have thought that Millwall had but to go to the Welsh Town to bring away the points last Monday, especially as Southend had done it on the Saturday. But the "Martyrs" won by the only goal of the match, and this victory will have given them heart for the fray to-day. Lindon, the manager, is again keeping goal spendidly, and of course his shadow does not grow less. Woodward was formerly a half-back. Of the halves Bishop is a new player from Rochdale, and he is doing very well, and of the forwards Phillips only was with the club last year, and he played in only 16 games. Mitchell comes from Pembroke Dock, Bell and Pither

from Torquay United, and Sutherland from Bristol City. Sutherland and Pither were at Millwall a few years ago, and the former in particular, we know as a very clever player.


