## COMMENTS ON THE GAME AND PLAYERS

This is the Town's last home engagement in the Football League, and we have only to register a win to go through the season without defeat at home. Naturally, Bournemouth will want to deprive us of that record, and they have quite a formidable list of successes on opponents' grounds, so our team have something to play for and to think about. It is rather a remarkable fact that last year Bournemouth won no fewer than seven games and drew four away from home, and thus if they had won all home matches they would have won the championship. This year they would have been candidates for promotion if they had won all their home games, for they have collected 16 points when visiting opponents, and a win today would give them a record similar to last season. They have dropped 14 points at home, however, and that spoils their record considerably.

Last Saturday they were defeated at home, and it is worthy of note that when

that has been their experience they have generally recovered at least a point on "foreign" soil in the next game. We do not want that to-day, and it is necessary that we should get at least one point in order to equal the 43 points obtained last season. With full strength available we should win.

There are two more home games to be played by the Reserves, Watford next Wednesday evening, and Chelsea next Saturday, and if we get four points from these we shall do very well indeed.

The first eleven conclude their programme by visiting Plymouth Argyle next Saturday.




