## COMMENTS ON THE GAME AND PLAYERS

Brighton and Hove Albion find us in a little bit of trouble, for it was not known until yesterday what players would be fit, and even now one or two who turn out may feel the effects of injuries. Richards, Galloway and Woods are still on the casualty list, and that is a pretty stiff dose with the season only a week old. We believe our supporters will be pleased with the signing of James Banks, and as he has kept fit in readiness for a game, he is thus able to step into the first eleven at once, owing to the incapacitation of Woods. Panther remains at centre-forward, and in the defence Graham resumes his old partnership with Till. The inclusion of Davies at outside left affords opportunity to experiment with Dennis at centre-forward in the second eleven, and Nunn re-appears on the extreme left in the team we have sent to Brighton. The whole of the players declared fit, therefore, are wearing jerseys to-day.

Brighton had a comfortable run in their opening game, when they defeated Brentford by 5-2 at Hove, and our old player, Norman Thomson, had the pleasure of scoring one of the goals, and

he also got the only goal for them at Newport on Thursday, when they suffered defeat by 3-1.

We have yet to record a win, and while we recognise that the Albion have a very good side, we are hoping to make a start to-day. In addition to Norman Thomson, the Albion include another old favourite with Luton followers in Reg. Williams, the old Watford goalkeeper, who captained the Albion in his first season with them. Thomson and Simpson are the only new players in the Albion's side.


