We will repeat for the larger crowd the statement made in the match card on Wednesday.

Precedence over all else must be given to our latest and best capture—John McCartney, our Manager. Probably every individual who reads these notes already knows that we have decided upon a most important step. We doubt if there has ever been an engagement that will meet with such unanimous approval as this, and we hope our supporters will regard this as a very real attempt on the part of the Board of Directors to make their Club equal to any in the country. If will and effort could have done, well, it would have been done long ago, but money counts for so much in these days, and Luton Town have had to contend against money and brains. What ever may be the view of our supporters about the work of the past, they will agree that in Mr. McCartney we have secured one of the finest judges of a player that could be obtained either for love or money. We are pleased to feel that it is not money alone that has

brought him here. Over 30 years ago he got an affection for Luton, and has never lost it, and we are absolutely convinced that he will find that those who knew him in his playing days have not forgotten him, and their children who have grown up have learned over and over again of the deeds of derring do for which he is famous.

We want to make it clear at once that he will have absolute control of the players, and will be their manager in the fullest sense of the word.

May he have a long and happy career at Luton, and live to see achieved such records as hitherto we have only hoped and worked for.

This is something of an experimental side, of course, but the left wing and Reid captivated the crowd on Wednesday night, and Black gave his best show of the season.

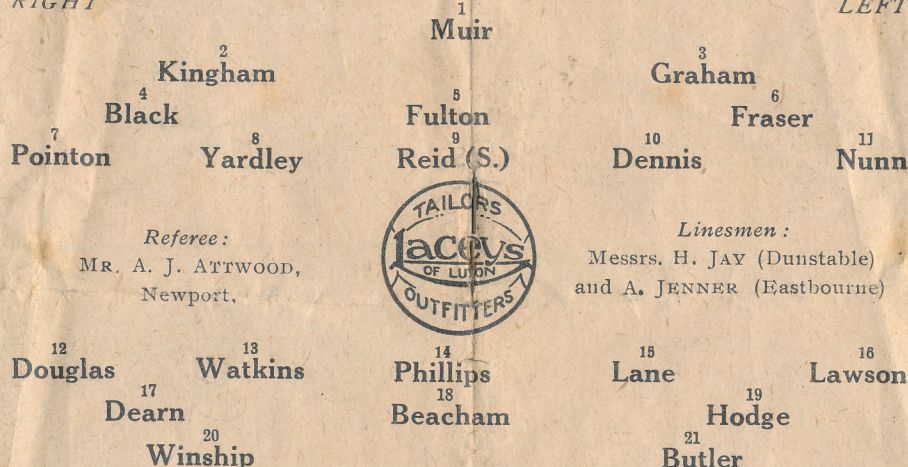

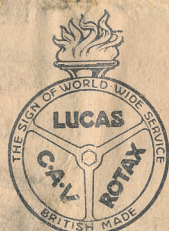
