COMMENTS ON THE GAME AND PLAYERS

We began last month with a victory. We should like to start November in the same way, but the Rangers are a pretty warm side, and they have won three of their six away matches, and drawn another. That is a remarkable record, and had their home results been up to what one expects, they would have headed the League.

We are hopeful that our lads will get on the winning way again. We have had a lot of misfortune, and it is our turn for a change.

For this match we have only one change, this being Banks at inside left instead of Harry Woods. The old 'Spur's two goals last Saturday for the Reserves were the result of opportunism, and we trust he will be just as lively a factor here this afternoon. We had hoped that Nunn would be fit to take the field

this afternoon, but his injury still keeps him out of the side, and neither he nor Black can be risked.

The Rangers have three changes from the side Millwall defeated at Shepherd's Bush last Saturday, all in the forward line. Paterson takes the place of Neil at inside right, and Johnson and Roberts form the left wing instead of Duthie and Lofthouse. Neil and Lofthouse were injured in the game with the "Lions." Turner and Roberts are the only new players in the Rangers' side. The former was with Bury, and Roberts with Watford last season.

Next Saturday we are due at Coventry, and the L.M.S. Rly. Co. are running an excursion as usual. It will leave Luton at 11 o'clock, and the team will travel by that train. The fare is 5/- return.




