COMMENTS.

Following the splendid victory over Fulham our supporters will not expect any change in the team this afternoon. The only alteration is that Fulton and Clark will begin in the positions they occupied in the second half last week. Thus Fulton is once more the pivot, and Clark plays at right-half.

Newport invariably put up a good game at Luton, and our meetings with them are amongst the pleasantest and best-conducted of the programme. We expect the same to-day.

It is interesting to note that Bob Anderson, our old player, is still with the County, and he must have as good a record of appearances as any player in the League. He made the full possible last season. On our side we have in Drinnan one who wore the black and amber for the County two seasons ago.

The County have collected only six points from ten games, but it must not be overlooked that they have played no fewer than six games away, and this is the seventh, and in two games only have there been more than one margin against them. Last Saturday they were desperately unlucky to lose in the last two minutes at Brighton.

Still, we hope to bring our record to a point per match to-day, and hope that the County will defer their successes until next week.

Next Saturday the Town are away at Torquay, and Brentford will visit Luton in a London Combination game. We may have a new player for this match.

Sylvia Beecher supports him well, and Polly Moran provides the comedy relief. Roy D'Arcy has a heavy role.

"OUT OF THE RUINS."

Richard Barthelmess is starred in "Out of the Ruins" being presented to-night. Adapted from a story by Sir Phillip Gibbs, the film deals with a young French Lieutenant, who, during the War, deserts his regiment to be with his sweetheart, whose parents are forcing her to marry another. On his return he is court-martialled and shot, but his comrades aim badly, and he is captured alive by the advancing Germans. He spends years in a German prison, and returns in time to claim his sweetheart from her still persistent suitor.

"THE WARE CASE."

You have the sensation of being actually present in the Central Criminal Court watching a man on trial for his life in "The Ware Case," which is described as the finest British picture ever screened, and is showing on Monday. The story has been treated in such a manner that the excitement is kept at fever heat from the first moment right up to the dramatic climax.
