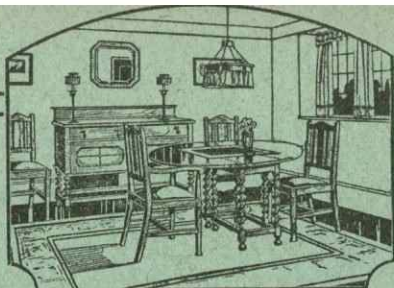

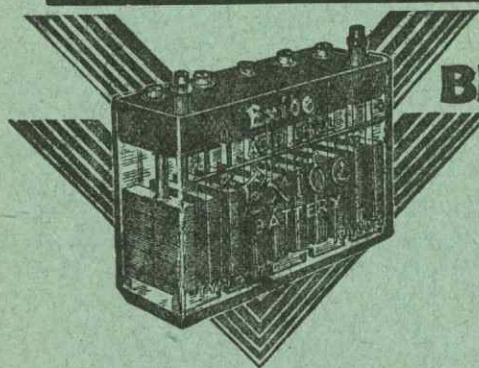

PLYMOUTH ARGYLE NOTES.

STILL UNDEFEATED.

History repeated itself last Saturday, when Argyle and Southend drew at the Kursaal with one goal each—the same score as last season. It was a fast and exciting game, and although there was considerable discussion regarding the goal scored by Bowden, the referee, who was up with the play in the Southend penalty area, had no doubt. Previous to the goal being scored Black and Bowden had hard luck with shots which hit the post. The Southend goal was also fortunate to escape downfall before the interval, from a series of corner kicks, and it was during this period that Jack Leslie was injured, and thereafter unable to take a share in the game. Black was also subject to a great deal of buffeting. But for being thus handicapped Argyle would assuredly have won. The half-backs all did well, Mackay being again indefatigable and clever, Hardie cool and resourceful and Pullen predominant with his head.

After Southend equalised through a spectacular goal, initiated by a bold run through by the right back, French. Bowden's goal was a masterpiece. Argyle's defence was not unduly tested excepting for a warm five minutes early in the game, Craig, Bland and Titmuss each in turn saving dangerous situations. As an index to Argyle's promotion prospects, this match was quite encouraging.

TO-DAY'S MATCHES.

So keen is the battle for promotion being staged in the Southern Section that, although Argyle are doing so remarkably well, only four points separate them from Brighton and Hove, who stand fifth in the League table. Brighton receive a visit from Exeter City this afternoon, whilst Southend journey to Swindon, Boscombe to Merthyr, and Brentford entertain Gillingham.

LUTON TOWN AT HOME PARK.

Luton Town defeated Merthyr by four clear goals last Saturday. The "Strawplaiters" were without Rennie, their crack goal scorer, last Saturday, and if he is unable to play this afternoon, it is likely the visitors will rely on last week's choice, which means that few new players will be on view. G. Harford, who figured in the majority of Millwall's matches last season, is now guarding goal for the Bedfordshire club, and J. Drinnan, the clever inside-left, played for Brentford. A. Smeaton, left half-back, captained Torquay United, and played against Argyle last year. D. Richards, left-back, is reputed as being in splendid form this season, and is of fine physique, standing nearly 6 ft. and weighing 13 st. 4 lbs.

Argyle won the corresponding match last season by 2—0, Black scoring both goals.

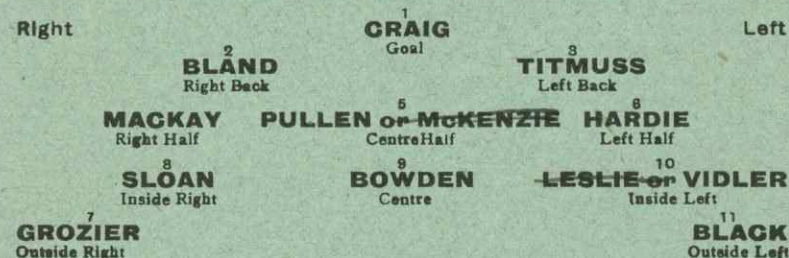

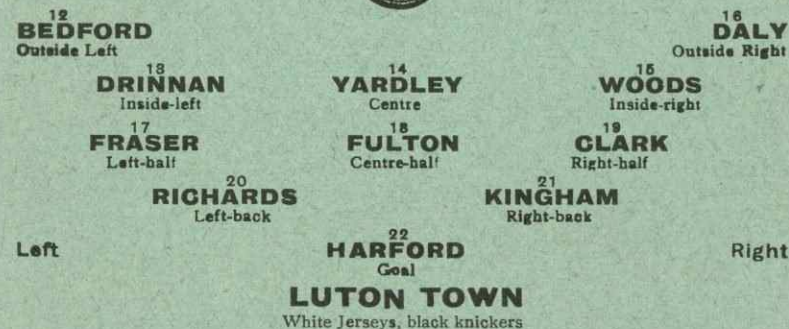

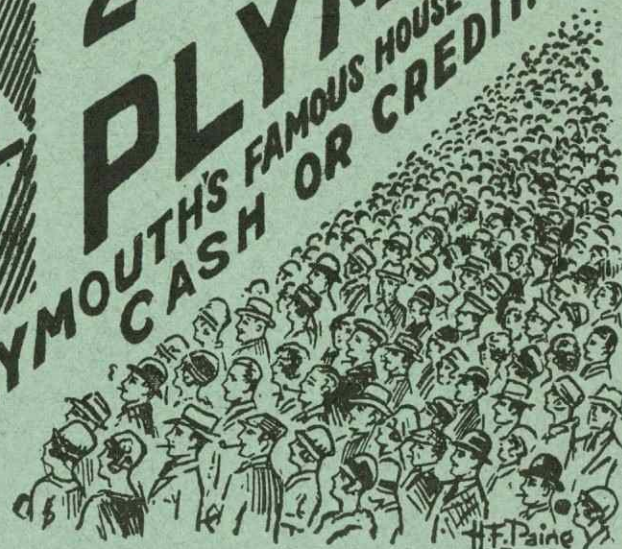
