



The Local Cup Derby.

TO-DAY we entertain our near friends from Luton in the Second Round of the F.A. Cup, and given favourable weather, a huge attendance is anticipated. It is many years since we have met in the F.A. Cup Competition proper, and whatever the result of to-day's game may be, our patrons are promised one of the keenest struggles in the history of the club.

Luton Town have a good cup-tie team as has been proved by their decisive win over Clapton Orient at the second attempt. It is probable that there will not be much difference in our visitors' eleven from the team we defeated in the league match here earlier in the season, but cup-tie fare is entirely different from the ordinary league games, and it behoves all of our players to give of their very best to-day in their endeavour to go into the "hat" for the next round of the Cup.

Brentford Take Both Points.

Brentford again demonstrated to us last Saturday that they are still among the best teams in the Southern Section, and although the score of three goals to one against us was perhaps a bit flattering to the visitors, they just deserved to win if only for the way they clinched the opportunities offered them. In the first half-hour of the game it looked as though we were to turn the tables on them, as we were completely on top and on one or two occasions were unfortunate in not opening our

account. The visitors, in fact, were penned in their own half when both their goals were scored from breakaways.

The score of two goals to nil at half time rather flattered the visitors, but after they had got their third point from the "mysterious penalty" the visitors took command of the game and ran out worthy winners.

Our team as a whole did not produce anything like the form they have shown in their previous games, a lapse which we hope is only temporary.

Reserves at "The Dell."

Our reserves did very well in getting a point from their visit to Southampton last Saturday, and with the least slice of luck probably would have won. Lowe, who occupied the centre forward position for the day owing to White being ill, had a goal disallowed for some unknown reason, when he bundled ball and goalkeeper into the net "quite legitimately" we thought. In our opinion he was the ablest forward afield.

Holland, J. K. Smith and Lewis, in the defence, had a remarkably good match, clearing the lines well and tackling fearlessly. When the youthful side of the team is considered, we can look forward to better results in future when they gain a little more experience.


