

CLUB GOSSIP

(by *Wanderer*).

To-day's opening of the football season will be welcomed with enthusiasm all over the country. Bad weather has played havoc with outdoor sports during the Summer months, but football has the advantage in this direction and will be more than usually welcome for this reason.

Most of the League Clubs have played one or more practice games and much has been written concerning their prospects for the coming season. A feature of professional football is the optimistic way in which the smaller clubs come up smiling at the beginning of each season, in spite of many difficulties which handicap them in competition with the bigger clubs.

Although Reading football suffered a big disappointment by suffering relegation last season, we come up smiling again to-day, determined to make a big effort to win back our lost position and, if the lesson of last season has been profitably learned, there is no reason why we should not succeed.

On numerous occasions during the last campaign our players demonstrated that the talent was there, but the will-to-win spirit was lacking and if this fault is remedied the team should do well.

During the "close season" several changes have taken place in the management of the Club, chief of which is the appointment of Mr. Joe Smith, the ex-international and Bolton Wanderers' forward as team manager. With his practical knowledge of the playing side of the game, coupled with his strong personality, we confidently anticipate a successful career for Mr. Smith and wish him every success in his new role. Most of the players who figured in the League team last season were resigned and five new players have joined our ranks. Limited resources have compelled us to go very steady in securing new players, but further signatures may be expected almost immediately.

We have a stiff programme for the opening month of the season, with eight first team matches to play, three at home and five away, against what are considered some of the strongest sides in the competition. The value of a good start and its influence on both players and officials cannot be over-estimated and we expect to open the season in a far different manner to last year.

Our opening fixture is at Elm Park with Luton providing the opposition. The Bedfordshire club generally gather together a useful combination of players and the game should furnish us with a fair test of the standard of Third Division football. During the close season Luton secured three players

from Bolton Wanderers, Kean and Miller, and Tait and the former is the international half-back previously with Sheffield Wednesday.

The second team will travel to Luton for the opening match in their London Combination fixtures.

Prior to this afternoon's game the new terracing at the town end of Elm Park will be officially opened and should be a boon to all who patronize the popular side of the ground. For this excellent work the club is deeply indebted to the Reading Supporters Club and the Board of Directors take this early opportunity of publicly expressing their grateful thanks to the Supporters Club and especially those members who have been actively engaged in carrying out the work.

In conclusion the club management appeals for the loyal support of all lovers of football in the town and neighbourhood in its endeavour to win back a place in the Second Division. Your regular attendance at Elm Park both at Third Division and London Combination matches will encourage both players and officials and prove that you are doing your bit to help.
