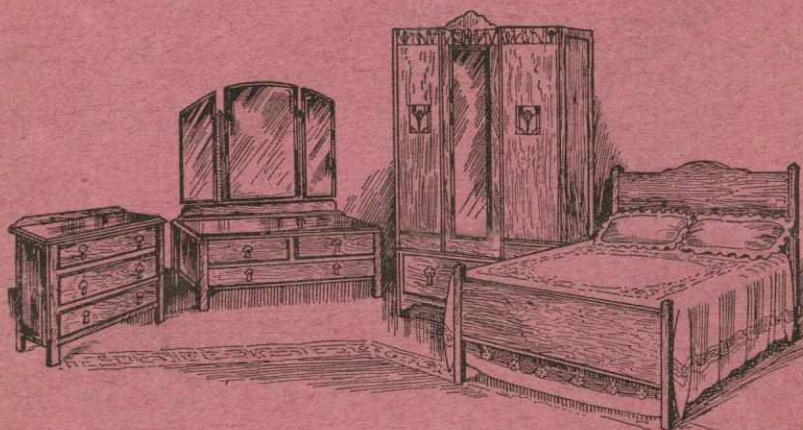

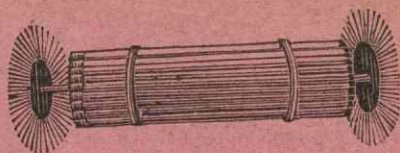

Notes from the Hive.

By "BUSY BEE."

Keep it up, lads! We are all proud of you. Four successive victories makes good reading, especially when success has come as the reward of good play.

There could be no two opinions that the Bees well deserved their win over Reading last Thursday evening. Team work triumphed once more—as it always should do. It also enabled the Bees to record their first "double" of the season.

A THREE-GOAL WIN.

Play during the early stages was not too inspiring, neither team succeeding in keeping the ball on the ground. Later a vast improvement was seen in the play of both teams, particularly Brentford, and the large crowd, for an evening game, were put on good terms with themselves when Billie Lane put the Bees in front at the end of sixteen minutes. Chief credit for this goal must go to J.C. Burns and Berry, our left-wing pair, for it was their clever leading-up play which enabled the last-named to place across such a dangerous centre that Richardson, the Reading goalkeeper, was glad to punch clear while hampered by a number of players. Our centre-forward cleverly anticipated what might happen and had dropped back. The ball came to him, and without more ado he promptly placed it through a crowd of players into the net.

The second half had only progressed three minutes when Jackie Foster put us further ahead. Our little winger took a smart header from Lane in his stride and went on to place the ball into the net. It was nearly half an hour later when the scoring was completed. But what a goal! Foster made a back centre which Billie Lane met in his stride and crashed the ball with tremendous force past the visiting goalkeeper.

We sympathise with the visitors in having their centre-forward, Bacon, injured early in the game, for his usefulness was greatly impaired afterwards. By no stretch of imagination, however,

could the defeat of the visitors be attributed to this happening, for the Bees held such a big territorial advantage that their ultimate success was fully merited. Still, only some able goal-keeping by Nash—who was not greatly troubled, taking the game all through—prevented the visitors from gaining some tangible success. They certainly deserved to have the satisfaction of scoring—which was, however, denied them.

LUTON HERE TO-DAY.

This afternoon we have the pleasure of extending a cordial welcome to Luton Town. Last season our visitors from Bedfordshire took three points from us, including a win at Griffin Park, where they scored the only goal of the game. We want no repetition of that kind of thing this afternoon, and if the Bees play up to their normal form we feel that they are capable of gaining the verdict, but it is sure to be a well contested game, for Luton are noted for their strong and dour qualities.

So far this season Luton have done reasonably well. Only one defeat has been suffered at home, all other visitors to the Luton ground having been denied the consolation of a goal, let alone a point. In away games our visitors have been beaten by the odd goal at both Fulham and Reading, while they won at Gillingham by a similar margin to that which the Bees triumphed a week ago.

A change of manager took place at Luton during the close season. Mr. George Kay, the old West Ham centre-half, who had been in charge, left to take a similar appointment with Southampton, and in his place Mr. Harold Wightman, also a well-known centre-half in his playing days with Derby County, left Notts County to take over the managerial reins. In addition to Fred Keen, the well-known international half-back from Bolton Wanderers, other new players signed were Willson (full-back) from Hull City, while new forwards are Wales (Kilmarnock), Loasby (Gillingham) and Turner (Notts Forest). We shall all miss one player from the Luton team. He is Archie Clark, our former half-back, who was transferred to Everton just before the close of last season.

AT CARDIFF NEXT SATURDAY.

Our League side are due at Cardiff on Saturday next, when we hope to see the Bees repeat their great Cup success of last season. It will be remembered that after the Welsh club had drawn at Griffin Park, the Bees won the replay at Ninian Park by the odd goal in three. Now then, Bees, what about meting out a similar dose. A win at Cardiff is sure to swell the attendance for the visit of Northampton a week later. And we do so like to see big crowds at Griffin Park.

The Reserves have an important London Combination encounter on this ground on WEDNESDAY next, September 30th, when the Arsenal Reserves will be the visitors; a good game should be witnessed. The kick-off is at 3.30 p.m.

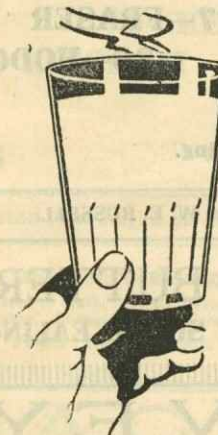

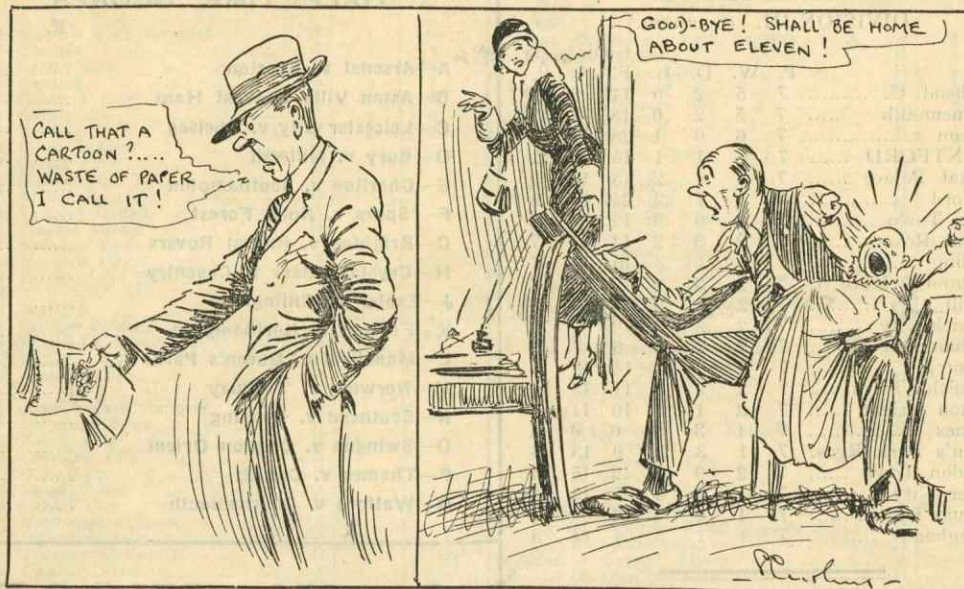
