

## NOTES FROM THE HIVE.

### ALONE—IN ALL THEIR GLORY.

At the moment of writing only two clubs in the whole of the Football League have won every point to date. They are Bradford City and BRENTFORD. That very fact makes us all very proud of the Bees, and we are all hopeful that our favourites will be the very last club to come off the "Gold," i.e., 100 per cent. standard. The achievement of Brentford to date is all the more meritorious inasmuch that three of the five games have been played away from home. Keep it up Bees, and your reward will surely come.

### EASY CHANCES MISSED.

Coventry City were only beaten by the odd goal in three at Griffin Park, but the narrowness of the margin was solely due to the weak finishing of our forwards. On two or three occasions it certainly seemed much easier to score than fail, but apart from the fine penetration of Jack Holliday, the display of Brentford in the important art of finishing in this game was indeed bad. Brentford should have been two goals up before Holliday gave us the lead in the eighth minute of the game. This goal was indirectly the outcome of a corner taken by Crompton, who sent the ball over to the opposite wing, where Foster returned it to the goalmouth and Holliday did the rest.

A few minutes later some clever individual play by Scott gave Holliday another chance to score a really great goal.

Midway through the second half the visitors reduced the margin to a solitary goal, when Bourton converted a penalty kick, at a second attempt, after Baker had saved the first shot but could not retain possession.

### ANOTHER ODD GOAL VICTORY.

Any team that wins at Exeter has performed a bit out of the ordinary, for precious little is conceded in the course of a season by the "Grecians" on their own ground. Consequently we pat the Bees on the back for the win they recorded at Exeter last week-end.

Having won both their home games, Exeter were anxious to retain their all-win record before their own supporters, but Brentford were just as keen to maintain their all-win record to date, so those present were given plenty of thrills. Exeter provided most of these in the first half and when they took the lead, fairly

late in the opening period, they deserved it. Their joy was short-lived, however, for right on the interval, Jack Holliday again proved his value as an opportunist by equalising the scores.

After the interval it was a very different story. The Bees played inspired football, and Exeter were overplayed for lengthy periods. The lead was gained when Holliday again beat the home goalkeeper, and after that it was nearly all Brentford. So complete was the mastery of our boys that the wonder is that further goals were not scored. Brentford left behind them at Exeter a very fine impression, and we all hope they will continue to do so everywhere they go. **RESERVES' EASY WIN.**

Our Reserves commenced the season with two home wins, but their stock slumped badly in the two following games at Swansea and Coventry. Happily they got back to winning form last week-end against Brighton, whom they defeated at Griffin Park by four clear goals. Allen (2), Stephens and McKenzie were the scorers. **LUTON HERE TO-DAY.**

The games during recent years between Luton and Brentford have been pretty close affairs, with honours fairly evenly distributed.

Last season we just managed to beat Luton, to whom we extend a very cordial welcome, by the only goal of the game.

To all appearances the match will be a very sternly-fought contest, for our visitors have got off the mark quite well this season, and at the moment figure fourth on the list. Their only defeat was sustained at Bristol, where the City won by five goals to two. Otherwise, Luton have taken three points from Clapton Orient, and won their home games against both Northampton Town and Coventry City.

Naturally the Bedfordshire club retained the best of last season's players, and amongst the new men engaged are three full backs: Ives (Lincoln City), Diaper (Arsenal), and Hayhurst (Frickley Colliery).

Mackey is a centre-half who comes with a fine reputation from Sheffield Wednesday, while new forwards include Alderson (Leeds United) and Hutchison (Carlisle United). Having commenced so well, Luton will probably call on few, if any, new players for to-day's game.




