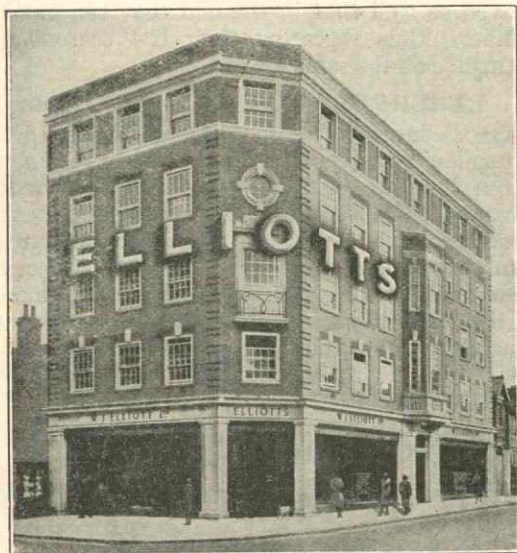

TO-DAY we contest the first of our "Derby" games with Luton Town, and while our visitors have been able to get off the mark somewhat better than ourselves, we have every reason to expect that another brace of points will be added to our list when to-day's game is ended. Our visitors have quite a number of new players on their list, and judging by their results to date, they have been doing well. The matches between us have always been keenly contested, and to-day's game should be no exception to the rule, so our followers should be treated to a rousing ninety minutes.

RESERVES VISIT HIGHBURY.

Our reserves will be up against very formidable opposition this afternoon when they tackle the Arsenal's reserve team at Highbury in their London Combination fixture, and all our players will have to be on their best form if they are to get anything from to-day's game. The Arsenal reserves are a very experienced team, but it was proved last Saturday, when they lost at home to Brentford Reserves, that they are not invincible. We feel sure that our team will give them a good run for honours.

GILLINGHAM DEPART POINTLESS.

Although it took us a long time to establish a lead in our match with Gillingham last Saturday at Vicarage Road, we think the visitors' defence must take credit for keeping their end up for such a lengthy period. Holland, in goal, had some of his inspired moods, and although beaten twice, he could not be blamed for he had no chance with either shot.

The visitors had a very go-ahead team, which probably upset our more methodical methods, but we could see beforehand what the ultimate result would be.

RESERVES WIN AT SOUTHEND.

Our second team did remarkably well to gather two points from their visit to Southend last Saturday, and it is no exaggeration to say that they might easily have won by a bigger margin, so well were they playing collectively. They started off up-hill, and during the early period got moving well, and it came as no surprise when James ran through to open the scoring, a feat he performed again prior to the interval. Crossing over with a two-goal lead the team, on the whole, played so well that in the end they ran out easy winners, thus repeating their last season's performance on the same ground.

RESERVES DEFEAT MILLWALL.

On Wednesday afternoon our second team gained a popular victory over their opponents from New Cross by four goals to one, and were worthy winners. The visitors still believe in players of good height, but with our fellows showing greater foot-craft, there were times when the opposition were made to look quite ordinary. A continuance of the form shown in this game is sure to result in placing us well up the league chart.

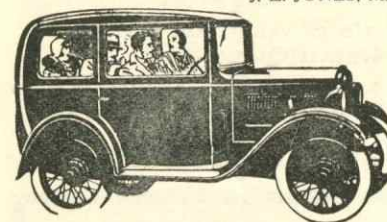
