We can shake hands with Cardiff City and sympathise with them on their experience last week. We nearly had as bad a shock the week before, but the blow would have more sting for the City, since Newport are their near neighbours. We had nothing to crow about ourselves last week, for we were very disappointed with the play of our team at Watford, and they shall need to be in better mood to-day if the City are to return pointless.

As a result of last Saturday's games, both teams are considerably changed. We have Jim Imrie in goal again, his first turn-out for the League team since September 3rd, when he was injured at Bristol. In attack are the other changes. Nelson comes back to the inside-right position, and if he will remember that he has colleagues with whom to work, we shall probably have no reason to regret the change, for Tom Tait should get a bit of help. The left wing is changed, Hutchison and Rowe being tried out as a combination, and we hope for the best from both.

The City have changes in all departments, except goal, where Farquharson still shines from week to week. Owing to injury Roberts stands down, Jenkins moving from the right to the left-back position, and a young amateur, Eric Morris, is tried at right-back. Evans is restored to the middle line, so that Jones returns to inside-left, his best place, while from the right wing Keating disappears and Hill steps in.

May we invite our supporters to take part in the whist drive at the Assembly Hall on Monday night. Very valuable prizes are offered, and we want to see a "full house." It is so that Andy Rennie may get something like the benefit he deserves.

This clever young 'keeper was brought from the north east by Harry Storer, the Derbyshire cricketer, who holds the reins at Highfield Road.

Critics at Swindon attribute the Railwaymen's lowly position to the fact that the forwards depend too much on Harry Morris to do the scoring.

Donald Mackay, Northampton Town's new centre-forward, was a draughtsman by trade before taking up professional football.

Rotherham United have only scored one goal away from home.


Henry Gibson, the centre-forward who led the Mansfield Town forward line a few years ago, is being tempted to leave Partick Thistle for a London club.



Those who have seen Jack Hulbert and Cicely Courtneidge on the screen before, are glad that in “Jack's the Boy” Miss Courtneidge has more abundant opportunity for the exercise of her comedy gifts. 
