

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

Club Gossip. *By Wanderer.*

Last Saturday's football matches were played under vile conditions in many districts, and our experience at Newport was extremely trying. The ground was almost a quagmire, and the intense cold wind and driving rain made the players' task a very unenviable one. Under such conditions football skill is right out of the question, and the result of a match depends upon which side can endure the elements best. Newport gained encouragement from an early goal, but this did not deter our lads, who kept at it, and inside half an hour scored twice. Before half-time Newport scored an equaliser, and the teams turned round all square. The second half opened similar to the first, with an early goal to Newport, but our players showed plenty of determination, and although unsuccessful with a penalty kick, the equalising goal was not long delayed. From this point right to the finish we were well on top, and only some masterly saves by the Newport goalie prevented us from winning outright. Jack Palethorpe is to be congratulated on his hat trick, but any comments on the football under such conditions would be out of place. Both teams are worthy of high praise for the way they kept at it on such a day.

This afternoon we receive Luton at Elm Park. The Bedfordshire club are old opponents of ours, and although their resources are limited, they usually manage to get

together a workmanlike side, season after season. This year's eleven is doing well, and at present the club holds a position close behind us on the league table. Last week they gained a sensational triumph over Cardiff City by eight goals to one, at Luton. This is by no means the only occasion they have run up a big score against strong opponents at Luton, and we have painful memories of a big defeat sustained there last season.

Brentford added another point to their lead as a result of last week's matches, and we must take care not to drop any more points at Elm Park if we are to overhaul them. Spectators should see a good hard match this afternoon, and we hope to improve our promotion chances as a result of it.

Curiously enough last week's Combination match at Elm Park ended with a similar result to the Newport game, each side scoring three times. Millwall sent a strong team, and they proved to be a smart combination. Although we crossed over with a three goals lead, there was not this difference between the sides in the first half, but our forwards snapped up their chances in fine style. After the interval, Millwall set about their task in smart fashion, and making the most of their physique in the heavy going, succeeded in drawing level. During this period our wing halves fell away badly, and the team became disjointed. Both full backs and goalkeeper stood up well to the dashing attacks of the visitors, and we had some anxious moments before the final whistle.

The team is without a match this afternoon, but meet West Ham Reserves at Upton Park on Monday.



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


