Dunn, Parry, Wilde and Manders have all been consistent players in the first eleven.

We have two more home games besides this, and we should like our supporters to make a special effort to turn up in big numbers for those two games, as well as for the remaining games with the Reserves. Two more "gates" such as we had on Easter Monday would go a long way towards levelling up the receipts of this season with those of last—especially if we have a £600 gate to-day!!
