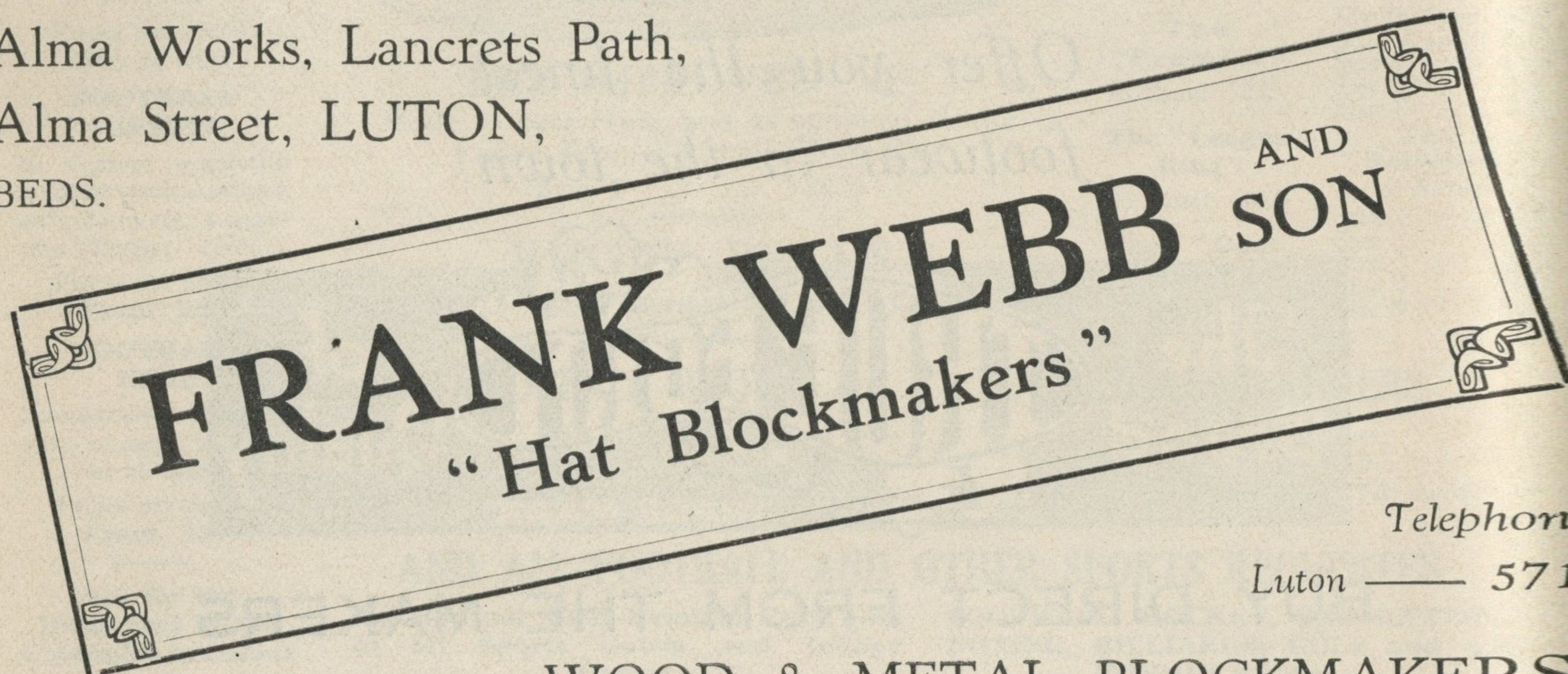

Cardiff City, whom we welcome for our return match this evening, is a Club whose fortunes, during the years of its existence, have been more checkered and varied than perhaps any other in the country.

Cardiff City was originally founded in the year 1899 under the name River Side, one which they took from the ground on which they played. An entirely amateur team at that period, they soon grew to be the premier eleven in the Cardiff district, having to contend with and fight hard for existence on account of the Rugby code which was prevalent in the district, and which could be said at that time to be the great Rugger stronghold in this country. A change of venue soon became necessary, and the River Side Club found themselves established at a public field known as Sophia Gardens.

With the advent of professionalism they played on two further grounds, first of all in the Old Park which was owned by the Marquis of Bute, and secondly at a place known as Fir Gardens.

When the town of Cardiff adopted 'city' status, the name of the Club was changed from River Side to its present title, and a decade after its original foundation the present Club was formed, which event was

marked by moving to more spacious quarters, its present home, Ninian Park, where accomodation is available for 60,000 people.

Admitted to the Second Division of the League in 1920/21 they speedily gained promotion, and remained in the First Division until 1928. This period has proved to be their zenith for in 1925 they were Cup Finalists and Runners Up in the League, whilst in 1927 the Cup made its initial appearance in Welsh Territory. From season 1928/9 misfortune befell them and from that period until 1931 only Second Division football was played at Cardiff. At the end of that season a further disappointment awaited them and they were relegated to the Southern Section of the Third Division finally reaching their nadir at the end of last season when they became the wooden spoonists and had to apply for re-election.

The commencement of this season appears to be the dawn of a new era for them. A brilliant start was made by winning their first two matches, and what must have been equally gratifying to the Cardiff Directorate was the appearance of something like old times in the matter of attendance. The official numbers at their game with us last Monday week was 18,608.

Albert Walters, whom supporters of six seasons ago will remember as the burly centre forward whose services we obtained from Aldershot, will this season be wearing the colours of Ilkeston Town.

Marcroft, the former Cardiff outside right, has been signed by Accrington. When Exeter City made their offer to him they learned that they were a matter of three hours too late.

Cardiff's luck still seems to be in the nether regions. Their latest casualty is Peter Molloy, a half back, who has been operated upon for appendicitis so making him hors de combat for at least six weeks.

Mr. Sam Jennings, who took over Mr. Wightman's duties at Notts County, has left the Notts Club for a similar position with Cardiff City.

Neil Harris, the new Swansea Manager, expects to recruit not a few players from Ireland where he was formerly stationed. He has also had the pick of the disbanded Merthyr Club.

John Jackson, whose transfer from Partick Thistle to Chelsea last season was greatly broadcasted by the newspapers, is again available to any club who is prepared to pay half the amount Chelsea expended for him.

Willie Harper, the former Arsenal and Scottish goalkeeper, has partly achieved his ambition to enter the training profession. Plymouth have re-engaged him on the terms that he will play when needed and also assist in the general training and coaching of the players.

Green, the Stockport County player, through signing for the Northern Section Club can now boast of playing in all four divisions of English League football. His previous Clubs were Bournemouth, Derby and last season Manchester United.

Although Doncaster Rovers made a profit of £1,600 last season it had every appearance of being a £200 loss until fortunately one or two belated transfers turned up and put the finances on the right side.

Norman Thomson, who was with us two seasons, 1925/6 and 1926/7, is now engaged in the motor repair profession. With his partner he has built up a profitable little business in East Ham.

Can You Answer These?
