Two welcome points

After three games without a win Millwall hit the winning trail in their home game with Swindon Town. It was a near thing for the "Lions" only got there by scoring the only goal of the game. The scarcity of goals clearly indicates that it was a very hard game, and indeed it was. As a spectacle the game did not reach very great heights for the inability of both teams to finish off good leading up play rather took the shine off the ginger bread. As often happens in such games the goal which decided the issue was scored early on. Good work by Yardley, who chased a ball that seemed certain to go behind for a goal kick, retrieved it and made a perfect low centre which Thorogood had run into position to accept.

The best of the visitors was seen after the interval when some strong attacks were launched and it took all the skill and resource of our defenders to keep the visitors from getting an equalising goal.

A Friendly encounter

Being without a League game owing to Torquay United being engaged in the F.A. Cup on Saturday last, a friendly game was played with Crystal Palace at Selhurst Park. As often happens in such games goals were fairly plentiful, eight being scored altogether, but as the home side claimed six they finished good winners on the day's play. Still, we shall not take this defeat to heart for the game produced much good football and the actual result was certainly not in accordance with the run of the play.

Reserves Review

Our Reserves got no change against Tottenham at White Hart Lane, for the junior Spurs notched five goals to which our boys were unable to reply. Two goals were divided in the Southern League game with Norwich City at New Cross. The visitors took the lead late in the first half but almost immediately Chedgzoy equalised.

On Saturday last Luton Town, who are making quite a good show in the London Combination this season, won at The Den by three goals to one. Chedgzoy was again our scorer.

A welcome win was recorded against Bournemouth on Monday last in a Southern League game, at New Cross, the "Lions" winning by the odd goal in five. Phillips (2) and Roberts scored.

Luton here to-day

Luton Town, to whom we extend a cordial welcome this afternoon, had a record very similar to that of Millwall, being one point less and one place lower on the League table than the "Lions." Three weeks ago the two clubs met at Luton and the spoils went to the home

side by an odd goal in three margin. That was a very hard game so it can almost be taken for granted that the return match this afternoon will also be a close affair. Millwall will be anxious to get level by turning the tables to-day, but Luton have shown great improvement on early season form and are now one of the best equipped teams in the section.

At Brighton next week-end

Our League side are due to visit Brighton & Hove Albion on Saturday next, and the fact that the sea-side club have only conceded one solitary goal at home this season gives some idea of the stiffness of the task which awaits our boys, but that will only make them even keener to be the first club to lower the colours of our friends and rivals at "London-by-the-Sea."

The Wembley trail

There was a lot of excitement all over the country on Monday last when the Draw for the Third Round of the F.A. Cup was made. Millwall, exempted from participation in the first two rounds, went into the "hat" along with all the other big League clubs and the draw came out WIGAN v. MILLWALL. So on January 12th the "Lions" will have to travel North to play the non-League club, Wigan Athletic, who beat Torquay United at Wigan last Saturday before an attendance of over 20,000.
