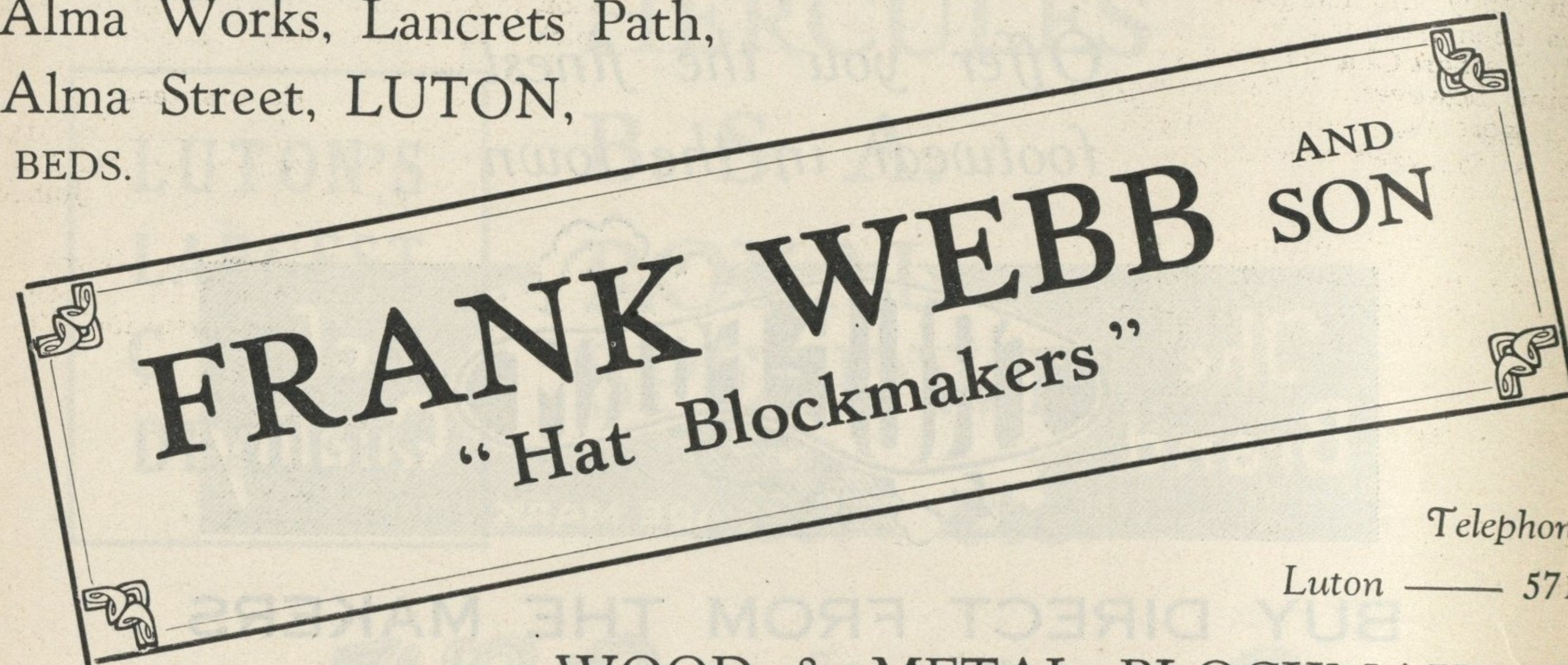

TODAY we welcome Exeter City, a Club whose history forms a continuous chapter of an arduous, but on the whole, successful struggle against adversity. Owing to this the "Grecians" have become well noted and famed for their capabilities as talent spotters, and many a rough diamond has been moulded into the finished article by the Devonshire Club. Doubtless the most famous player ever connected with the Club has been Clifford Bastin, but followers of football a decade ago still remember Dick Pym, the Topsham fisherman, who was eventually transferred to Bolton Wanderers and with whom he gained an International Cap. Bastin, himself, was an Exeter schoolboy, and his ultimate transfer to the Arsenal has been heralded by many as the best of the late Mr. Herbert Chapman's many deals. It is a curious point, however, that even this great football judge was more than dubious of paying a four figure fee for a youngster who was inexperienced in Football League circles.

Exeter City's nickname of the "Grecians" has always puzzled football followers, and at no time has a satisfactory explanation been effected as to how the Club received this soubriquet. Perhaps the nearest solution is that at one time near the City ground was a community of street traders who used to style themselves the "Grecians" but for what reason no one has ever been able to ascertain.

It was in the year 1908 that Exeter took the plunge and adopted professionalism, being elected that year to the old Southern League. A combination of unexpected circumstances gave Exeter City the chance to find a place on the football map. The secession of the "Spurs," who deserted the Southern League to join the Football League, created a vacancy and on the extension of the Southern tournament to a further two clubs the same season, Exeter City, together with Southend United and Coventry City, were elected to fill the vacancies.

The most memorable seasons of the "Grecians" are 1930-31, when they confounded all the critics by defeating Derby County, Bury and Leeds United in the Cup, and 1932-33, when they finished runners-up of the Southern Section, whilst last season they became the first holders of the Cup inaugurated for competition amongst the Southern Section Clubs.

- A. Chesters (goalkeeper) This is his second season with the Devon Club, and has improved to such an extent that he is preferred to Davis, the former Exeter keeper.
- J. Gray (right full back) Now enters his fifth season. A Scotchman by birth who emigrated to South Africa, and toured this country with the South African Team in 1924. Showed such good form that he was snapped up by Liverpool.
- C. Miller (left full back) Another Scot who first came into the limelight with Bellshill Athletic. Was signed up by Plymouth Argyle with whom he played for three seasons before joining Exeter City in 1926.
- S. W. Risdon (right half back) A youngster who was "picked up" last season as a forward. Has improved so much as a half back and has secured a regular place in the first team.
- H. Webb (centre half back) A Londoner by birth and assisted Walthamstow Avenue and Park Royal before signing for Fulham in 1930. Joined Exeter last season.
- J. Angus (left half back) A native of Newcastle who went to Exeter five seasons ago from Wolverhampton. Previously played for Wath Athletic and Scunthorpe.
- J. Scott (outside right) Born at Sunderland. His first club was Seaham Harbour, and later saw service with Sunderland, Crystal Palace, Kettering, Notts Forest and Northampton, before going West two seasons ago.
- F. L. Wrighton (inside right) A product of the North-East, hailing from Shildon. His first club was Ferryhill Athletic from whence he was tried by Darlington, eventually being transferred to Manchester City in 1930. Joined Exeter in March, 1932.
- H. Poulter (centre forward) A robust type of player who was discovered by Sunderland. Now in his second season but only of late weeks has earned a regular place in the side.
- C. Tierney (inside left) Was with Joe Coen at Guildford and was signed on by Exeter this season. Is very tricky and speedy and regarded as a good acquisition.
- S. C. Hurst (outside left) Originally was a centre forward and occupied that position in the match at Exeter in the early months of the season. Has subsequently filled the left wing position.

## CLUB NOTES by "Hatter."

The match with Aldershot on Saturday last was one of jubilation and sorrow. Jubilation at the manner in which the team, especially the forwards, so capably overcame the opposition, and sorrow at the unfortunate accident sustained by Charlie Fraser, who had the misfortune to break a leg, about twenty minutes from time. Never before has a crowd been so affected by an accident to a player as on this occasion, and hundreds left the ground long before the final whistle, all their pleasure at the boys glorious exhibition having vanished when this great calamity happened. The supporters however will be pleased to know that Charlie is progressing very favourably and Dr. Crarer is very delighted with the setting and his patient's general condition. No one could have shown a braver face than Charlie himself, and of all those who tended him, he was the only one who made light of his adversity. After the match Mr. Gould, the referee said to me "I could have cried when I saw him lying there, joking with the other players when he must have been in great agony. I could not speak, the only thing I could do was to shake his hand." To those of us who knew Charlie, we realise only too well that this is his nature, and our only hope now is that he will turn up smiling as we know he will do, when August rolls round once again.

Regarding the match itself, our boys again enhanced their reputations. Some say that it is the finest game they have played, but we must hesitate here, because they have given us repeatedly such delightful football that it is difficult to say which is the best. The forwards were brilliant, their movements being carried out with precision and accuracy, that it is no wonder the Aldershot defence floundered and Willie Robb had more goals by him than in any match this season. Indeed Aldershot were fortunate that they had between the sticks a person of Robb's capability or otherwise the score would have been well over double figures. Some of his saves bordered on the miraculous and however he got to one of Sam Bell's specials he alone knows. One thing we must admire Aldershot for; in spite of their adverse score they always played the ball and for this alone earned the approbation of all. Not many teams can take a "licking" in such good spirit as did our Hampshire visitors, and it is phenomenal that such a clean game should provide such an unfortunate accident. The accident by the way, can be blamed to no one.

The Reserves had a holiday on Saturday, but on Monday afternoon engaged in a Combination encounter with Clapton Orient. To comment on

the game or the players would not be fair, for the ground was atrocious, the heavy rain of the day previous turning it into a veritable quagmire, and this coupled with the rain that fell whilst the match was in duration, making good football absolutely impossible. This game too was marred by two accidents. In the first half Robertson of the Orient split his finger and had to leave the field in order that it could be stitched up whilst Beck had to be assisted off during the second period when an ankle injury received early in the game caused the joint to give way.

Today we entertain Exeter City, and Tom Mackey returns to the left back position, Smith crossing over, whilst McGinnigle resumes at centre half with Thayne on the left flank.

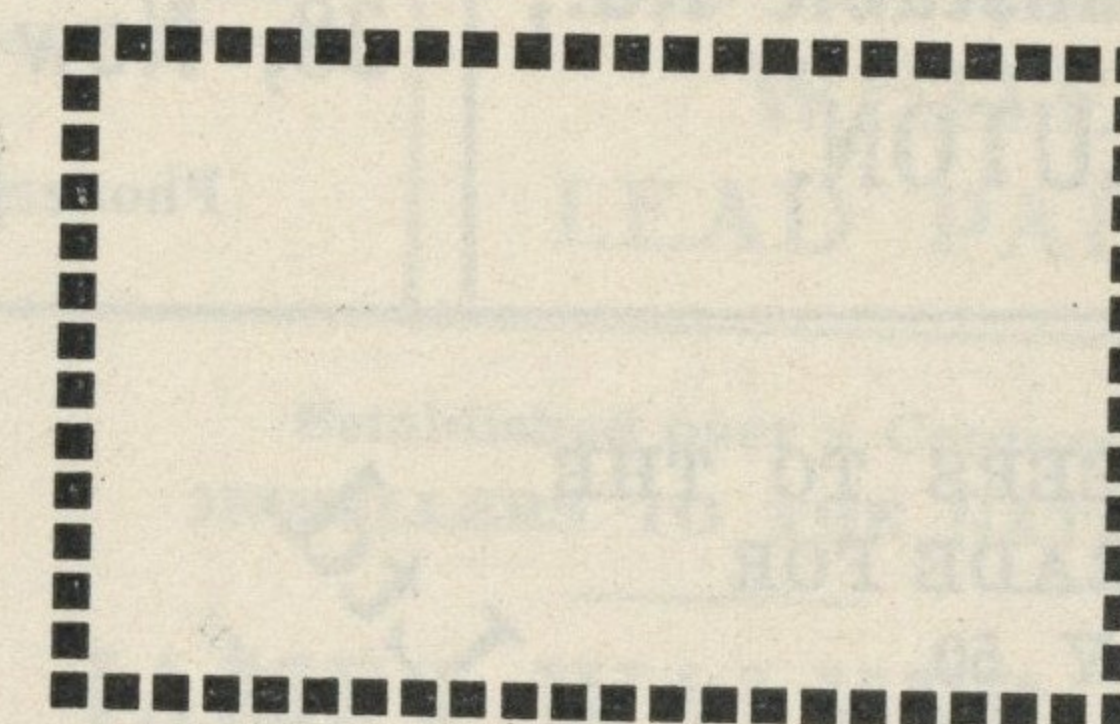

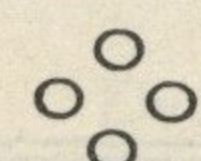

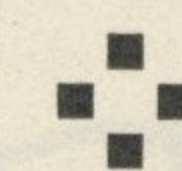
