LUTON TOWN v. CLAPTON ORIENT

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
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THERE is a saying that "the path of true love never runs smoothly" and if the words "a football club" could be substituted for "true love" how aptly could this phrase be used when one attempts a description of the events in the life time and history of the Clapton Orient Football Club. The "O's," especially of recent years, have suffered more vicissitudes than any club in our division and it augers well for the sporting qualities of the men who are now at their helm that they are slowly but surely piloting this old club through the reefs to the calmer waters beyond.

The birth of the Clapton Orient Club goes back as far as the dim and distant nineties when it was an amateur organisation with a long but undistinguished record of usefulness in the London district. In 1901, however, professionalism was adopted but it was not until five years later, in 1906, that they were enabled to eventually put their house in order and at the same time obtain entry to the Second Division of the Football League.

The road to success, however, has been strewn with disappointments and has at no time ever been an easy one to travel. No Cup or League honours have ever come their way and financially they have either first of all kept their heads above water or faced a loss at a season's end with the hopes that the tide would turn the following year.

Season 1928-9 was an exceptionally bad one for the East London Club for they finished in one of the two bottom places in the Second Division which of necessity meant the consequential relegation to the Southern Section of the Third Division. Shortly afterwards financial matters became very acute and the resultant position was that they relinquished their old headquarters at Homerton for pastures new at Lea Bridge Road.

This season the "O's" have shown marked improvement and when we met them at Lea Bridge earlier in the season we were obliged to be satisfied with a drawn game of one goal each. The two teams on that occasion were as follows:

Clapton Orient. Robertson, Searle, Crompton, Fogg, Fellowes, Ware, Mayson, Halliday, Foster, Crawford, Rigby.

Luton Town. Coen, Reece, Mackey, Brown, Thayne, Fraser, Martin, Bell, Ball, Rennie, Stephenson.

C. Hillam (goalkeeper) Height—5 ft 11 in. Weight—11 st. 10 lb. A Lancashire lad who had seen service with Clitheroe, Nelson, Burnley and Manchester United before arriving at Lea Bridge Road this season.

F. B. Searle (right full back) Height—5 ft. 9 in. Weight—12 stones. Was born at Wednesford. A rugged defender who was, for several seasons, on Charlton's books. Last season was with Watford.

W. Crompton (left full back) Height—5 ft. 7 in. Weight—11 st. 6 lb. A Welshman who has played most of his football in the Northern Section with Wrexham.

W. Fogg (right half back) Height—5 ft. 8 in. Weight—11 st. 9 lb. Was born at Birkenhead and brought out by Huddersfield Town. A fearless player he was transferred from the Yorkshire Club last season.

W. J. Fellowes (centre half back) Height—5 ft. 10 1/2 in. Weight—12 stones. Was discovered by Plymouth Argyle when playing for Tavistock. Could never find a regular place in the Devonshire team but has been a big mainstay for the "O's."

E. A. G. Ware (left half back) Height—5 ft. 8 in. Weight—11 st. 8 lb. Born at Chatham and played in Kent League football before joining Brentford in 1928. Was transferred to the Orient in 1933.

J. Miles (outside right) Height—5 ft. 6 in. Weight—10 st. 4 lb. A Welshman hailing from one of the numerous villages just outside Cardiff. His main Clubs have been Cardiff City and Leicester City.

V. Farrell (inside right) Height—5 ft. 9 1/2 in. Weight—11 st. 5 lb. A native of Preston and first played for Dick Kerr's team before joining Preston North End in 1930. Was secured by the Orient this season.

T. Foster (centre forward) Height—5 ft. 9 in. Weight—11 st. 10 lb. Like numerous other Northern lads first got his chance with a Southern Club and was on Reading's books until joining the East End Club this season.

E. Crawford (inside left) Height—5 ft. 10 in. Weight—11 st. 10 lb. His first club of note was Halifax Town, who received a substantial amount for his transfer to Liverpool in 1931-2. Was transferred to the Orient last season.

A. Rigby (outside left) Height—5 ft. 8 1/2 in. Weight—11 st. 9 lbs. Began his career as a goalkeeper but eventually became an extreme left winger. Has played for Crewe Alexandra, Bradford City and Blackburn Rovers, gaining a Cup Medal with the latter Club in 1928. Was transferred to Middlesbrough in 1932 and arrived at Lea Bridge last season. Played for England against Scotland and Wales.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter."

What a pity the weather last Saturday was so inclement. In spite of this, however, it did not retard about five thousand supporters from making the trek to Watford and I think they will claim they were amply compensated for the thrilling game that was witnessed. The result itself was a very fair reflection of the game, we should have considered ourselves extremely unfortunate of having had to depart without one point, for at a conservative estimate we should have been awarded two penalties, one when Jack Ball was brought down in the area and again when Woodward handled. In addition to this Jack Ball scored a real good goal that was ruled offside through the flagging of a linesman. The two goals scored by Watford were real gems. Lane hitting first time a centre from Rattray the ball entering the net with a cannon like effect, Coen having no chance. The second by Lowe was another great shot from just outside the penalty area. On the stroke of half-time Jack Ball neutralised Lane's effort, whilst in an exciting final ten minutes of the match Jack repeated his first half score with but a minute to spare. There is also one word of praise due to the team as a whole and that is for their wonderful enthusiasm and eagerness when a goal down and with but a few minutes left for play they tried to save every possible minute. Did you notice how Joe Coen literally chased after a ball that had gone well behind for a goal kick, speeded back with it and then punted it back down the field? How Wilf Crompton leapt the rails for a ball that went for a throw in, threw it in from behind the rails and then jumped back to take up his position? This is but two examples of the splendid team spirit which predominates in the ranks and is the reason for our successes. Joe Coen kept a great goal but the defence as a whole was not so good as in previous games. They appeared to be uncertain of the antics of the ball on the wet ground, and were at times, especially early in the game, somewhat puzzled at the wiles of the Watford forwards. As the game wore on, however, they settled down and gave a good display. The forwards again did well and Fred Roberts was always a schemer. Fred had hard luck too, just before the close with a magnificent shot from which McLaren effected an equally magnificent save. Anyhow it was a fitting result to a thrilling game and neither Watford or ourselves can claim any predominance over each other this season.

The "Stiffs" could only manage to force a draw with their visitors from Reading. The ground was in a bad condition, the incessant rain and the fairly high wind that was also blowing causing havoc with the intentions of both teams. Often a pass, which under ordinary conditions would have found its billet, was speeded out of play immediately the sphere contacted with the ground. Mistakes, mainly on account of this, were frequent and the result of three goals each was a very fair result.


