

Our Easter opponents this season are Newport County and we extend to them a cordial "Easter Egg" on their visit to our ground today.

It will seem strange in future seasons when we either pay a visit to or receive a visit from our Western opponents that we shall not be greeted by their jovial secretary-manager, Mr. James Hindmarsh, for a week or so ago he intimated to his Directors that he desired to relinquish his position at the end of the current season. The break, as is only to be expected, will be made with sad feelings on both sides, for "Jimmy" as he is popularly known, has seen them through all vicissitudes, which with the slump that has been prevalent throughout South Wales for so many years, has more often than not been of an adverse nature.

Newport County Football Club was formed in the season 1911-12 by a number of immigrants from the Midlands, who made the journey to South Wales owing to the prosperity of the iron industry. South Wales was, at that time, the heart of Welsh Rugby and the new code was regarded with no little hostility by the "natives" for quite some time. For a long time the Club devoted their attention to competitions in South Wales and the South of England, and soon after the War were elected as members of the Southern Section of the Third Division of the Football League. Since that time the club has been saved many times either by public subscription or by transfer fees.

The "Ironiders" struck a bad patch in season 1930-31, when they finished in one of the last two places in the League Table and subsequently were unable to seek election. Fortunately they were

re-elected the following season, 1931, only again having to make a further successful application for re-election at the end of that season. The nickname "Ironiders," which has clung to the Monmouth Club, has at oft times been a subject of debate, some reports stating that the name is intended as a compliment to the ironworkers who were responsible for the formation of the Club, whilst others say that the name is derived from the fact that Somerton Park is situated in Cromwell Road.

In Austria Prince Starhemberg, the Heimwehr leader has been made "sports dictator," and has absolute power to dissolve any sports club or association or to dismiss club secretaries and other officials throughout Austria.
