TONIGHT'S match ends our League programme at home so far as this season is concerned and we shall then have to patiently content ourselves with a four months rest until the new era dawns. Doubtless we are all wishing that our results at the commencement of the present campaign had been more auspicious, but alas they proved to be otherwise and it is now no good crying over spilt milk. We must wait and hope for better things next season.

Gillingham, our visitors for the final home encounter, were formerly known as New Brompton, and as such were admitted in 1894 to the Second Division of the Southern League, the other members being Sheppey, Old St. Stephen, Uxbridge, Bromley, Chesham and Maidenhead. The formation of the Club was made the previous year and was due to that fine old Kentish sportman, Alderman J. Barnes, an enthusiastic supporter of the Soccer code. This gentleman on many occasions proved himself to be a good friend to the Club, for which he had done so much when it was in the making.

In those days the smaller Southern League Clubs were financially weak, and considerable difficulty was experienced in getting together a good team, but although

New Brompton had many difficulties to contend with, the team signed on for the first season's campaign was well above the average, and they proved their worth by winning the championship. This is all the more remarkable for at that time teams of the calibre of Tottenham Hotspur and Southampton were at that time operating in the division.

When the two sections of the Third Division of the Football League were formed Gillingham became an English League Club, but since then it has had a somewhat chequered career. Season 1931-2 found them at the bottom of the League Table but re-election came along at the Annual Meeting of the League.

Gillingham have invariably been exceptionally prominent in local competitions, but as far as the F.A. Cup is concerned fortune has not been with them, and their most outstanding performance, and today they look upon it as particularly such, is that of season 1899-1900 when after five games in the third qualifying round the defeat of Woolwich Arsenal, as it was then, was obtained.

The highest "gate" ever recorded at Gillingham was on January 16th, 1924, with Cardiff City as visitors the attendance reaching 19,472.

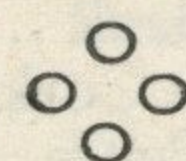

CAN YOU ANSWER THESE? ANSWERS ON OPPOSITE PAGE

1. What action should a referee take regarding a player who is about to play in a game whilst wearing spectacles? Could the wearing of spectacles be considered as "liable to cause injury to another player" and would a referee be supported if he took the action set out in the official decision? Alternatively, if the referee took no action and some other player in that game met with a head injury through coming into contact with the spectacles which were being worn, what would be the position of the referee?

2. Prior to a match, all the players except the home team captain are on the

field. No other player of the home side will take the responsibility of tossing the coin, and when the captain does turn up he uses bad language to the referee, who had urged his team to begin without him. What is the correct procedure to adopt?

3. "A" running hard for goal stops dead. A following opponent accidentally treads on his heel. "A" deliberately lets the ball go and makes toward the opponent in a threatening attitude. The referee stops the game. How should the game be restarted? "A" did not strike opponent.

4. A player has been sent off the field prior to the game starting. Can the referee refuse to allow another player to take the other's place?

ANSWERS to QUESTIONS ON OPPOSITE PAGE

1. The referee is to judge whether the players are wearing matter liable to cause injury to another player. If the referee permits the wearing of spectacles (and there are many players who do wear spectacles and play) then any accident consequent can only be considered as in the ordinary course of the game and no blame can be attached to the referee.

2. The use of bad language to the referee is deemed violent conduct for which there is only one punishment— instant dismissal. The referee, who is treated as in the incident quoted, should order off immediately the captain who so

badly misconducted himself by using the bad language.

3. The method of restarting the game in this incident depends on why the game was stopped. If the referee deems the action of "A" as ungentlemanly and so cautions "A" then a free kick would restart the game. If the referee stopped the game without judging the player's action as ungentlemanly then the game is restarted by dropping the ball.

4. If the game had not started when the player was sent off, then his team in accordance with Law 1 has the right to make up its numbers to the eleven players allowed by the Law and the referee has no right to refuse a team its eleventh player. If the match had started then refusal must be made.
