Without doubt, Luton Town are going to make a bold bid for premier honours in the Third Division, and as in the past, the better the opposition the better our lads serve up their portion of the enjoyment. We are hoping to put the first peg in the way of our visitors' aspirations.

The home game last season resulted in a draw of 1-1, and if we can only go one better this time we think we shall have done something to justify the confidence of our very sympathetic and ardent supporters, and thereby create an impression which will most certainly compel every one of you present to-day to

bring along a friend for our second League game on Thursday evening next when Reading are our visitors.

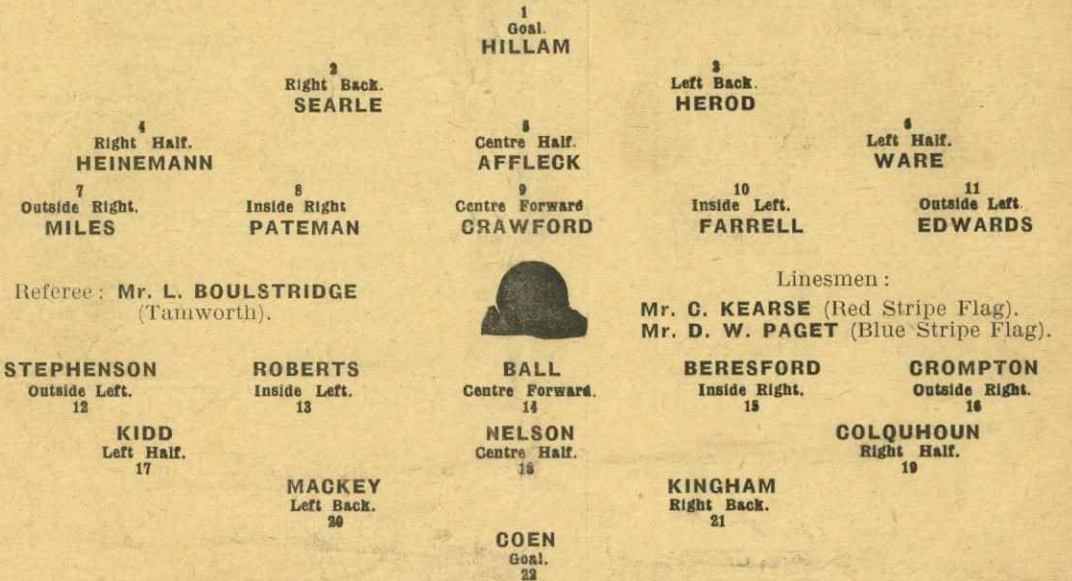
