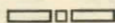

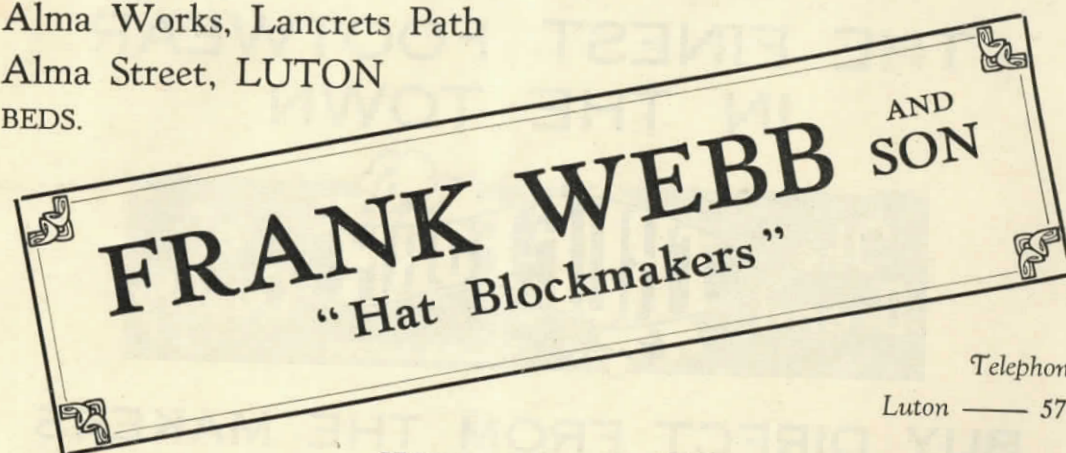

We welcome tonight our old friends from Shepherds Bush. Prior to their last two matches at home, on Thursday and Saturday last, when they successfully accounted for, first of all, Brighton and Hove Albion by three goals to two and then Aldershot by five goals to nil, the Rangers had made an equally inauspicious commencement to that of ourselves, for the only point they had previously obtained was a drawn game of one goal each against Brighton and Hove Albion on the Sussex Club's ground. That they have favourably overcome their early misgivings can well be judged from their last two results.

Our ground is not a happy hunting place for the Rangers as only on one occasion, in season 1927/8, have they been successful here, although last term a hard fought match ended up all square. We on our part have been equally unfortunate at Shepherds Bush and can only claim one victory and one drawn game. What will the result tonight prove to be?

The personnel of the Rangers Club has changed considerably since last year. First of all Mr. William Birrell the Middlesbrough star forward of past seasons and previously the Manager at Bournemouth has control of the reins in place of "Mick" O'Brien. Only ten of last season's players were retained and of these Barrie the full back was ultimately placed on the transfer list and Goodier the centre half figured in an exchange of players with Watford, Lowe inside left, being the arrival at Ellerslie Road. New players engaged include Allan from Huddersfield, Rowe a full back and Samuels from Reading, Ballantyne from Partick Thistle, Banks from West Bromwich Albion, Vincent a centre half from Manchester United, Molloy from Cardiff City, Hammond from Darlaston Town, Carr a full back from Reading and Fletcher an inside forward that Mr. Birrell brought with him from Bournemouth.

We are looking forward to an enjoyable game and if precedent can be a recommendation to an equally hard fought one as well.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

It was very good news to hear we had gained a draw at Northampton on Saturday, for a point from the "Cobblers" is always one well earned. Is this the beginning of a change for the better? We all hope so. The disturbing factor, however, is the paucity of goals that the forwards have notched. Two goals in five games, and one of these from a penalty, is not good enough. If we are to win matches goals must be scored, and the first team forwards would do well to take a leaf out of the Reserves' book, for from their five games they have accumulated eighteen.

There was a good sprinkling of supporters at the County Ground to welcome the boys when they turned out. Jack Ball was unfortunate in the choice for ends and the team had to face a strong breeze. This breeze, by the way, had a very strong effect on the game, for its frolics at times caused hazardous moments to both teams and ball control oftentimes was made exceedingly difficult. Possibly this was the cause of the little enthusiasm shown by the spectators for the game. The opening half saw both teams having an equal amount of the game but the respective defences were at the top of their form, Reg Kingham being especially prominent, with the result that only on rare occasions was either goalkeeper troubled. The second half was more or less a repetition of the first, but during this period we had at least two splendid opportunities of gaining the lead, one when Jack Ball completely missed an open goal following good combination by Crook and Beresford and secondly when Frank Beresford's header from a centre by Mark Crook struck the upright. Northampton, too, had their chances but they were equally ineffective.

The Reserves gave the supporters, who turned up here, plenty of goals and I venture to assert that if they had fully extended themselves double figures could easily have been obtained. The "O's" put up very little resistance and almost from the time they entered the field it seemed as if they looked upon defeat as imminent. It is true they had had two other matches in mid-week, one at Portsmouth on the Monday evening and a second at Lea Bridge Road against West Ham on Thursday evening, and were perhaps somewhat leg weary. Indeed it certainly appeared as if they were. Bill Thayne opened the scoring after about a quarter of an hour's play following a well placed kick by George Turner. It was the winger too, who was responsible for the second goal just before the interval for after outstripping the defence he afforded Cook a perfect pass which the centre easily turned to account, whilst everyone thought a third goal was scored when Andrews' shot struck the upright, but the goalkeeper recovered from the rebound to give away what proved to be a fruitless corner. Within two minutes of the restart a third goal was scored. Cook was fouled outside the penalty area as he was endeavouring to force a way through. Bill Thayne took the "free" and a great shot had Wall beaten all ends up. George Turner obtained his usual shortly afterwards. Taking the ball almost to the goal line he fired in and the ball entered the net just inside the far post. To complete the tally Crompton and Turner added further goals. Our boys were never fully extended and after they had tested initial success, seemed to think they could score just when they pleased, which they more or less did.

Tonight we entertain Queens Park Rangers. In their last two matches our visitors appear to have found a successful forward combination for they have found the net on no fewer than eight occasions. What the composition of our team will be is not known at the time of writing. The lack of successful scoring shots is very disturbing so I should not be surprised to find one or two changes in the front rank.

Tomorrow evening we are taking a team to Biggleswade (our annual match for the benefit of our nursery club). Let us hope it will be of good financial benefit to them.

Like most clubs we have had our share of injuries in the opening matches, but it is good news to hear that both George Martin and Joe Taylor will soon be out again. Davie Colquhoun has been suffering from a severe cold, whilst Charlie Fraser is progressing very favourably. We shall be pleased to see him kicking the ball about again.

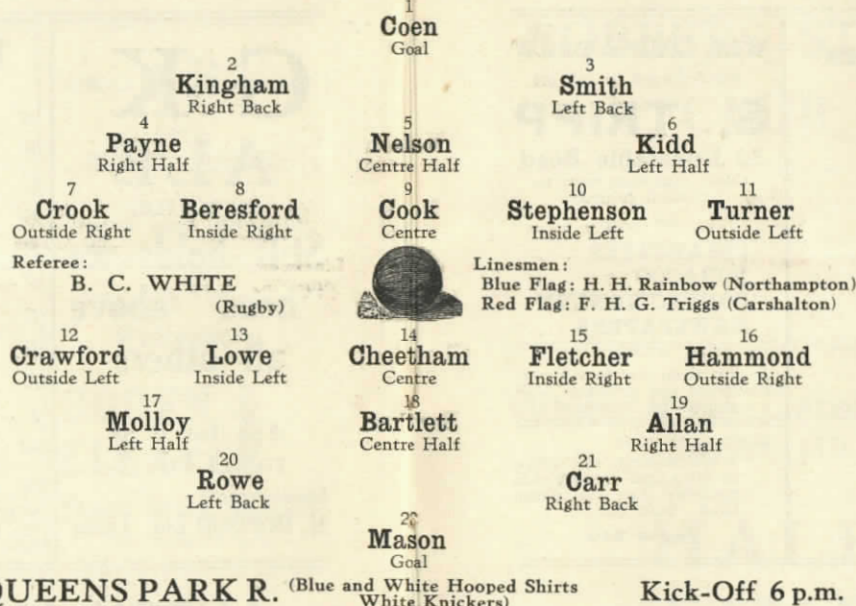

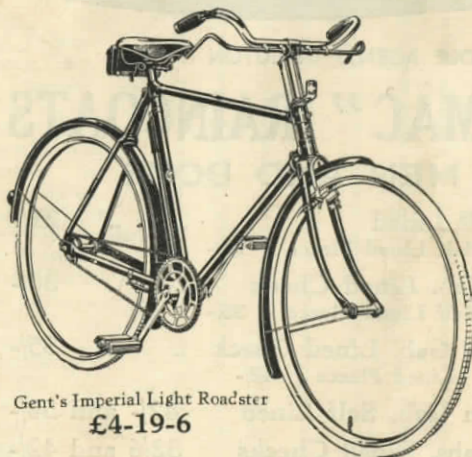
