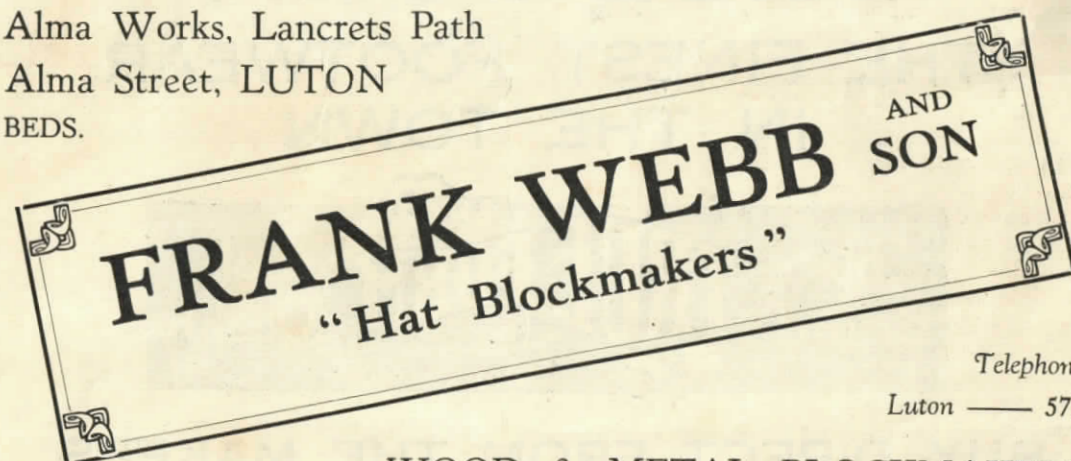

PREVIOUS tussles between the "Glaziers" and ourselves have always produced interesting games in which the spoils have gone slightly in favour of our visitors. The Palace have always been able to command a well balanced team and from the results to date it seems, as if again this season, they will be somewhere around the top of the League table when the first Saturday in May eventually dawns.

The "Glaziers" have proved victorious in four of their six matches, having accounted successfully for Cardiff City by three goals to two, Southend United by three goals to nil, and Bournemouth and Boscombe by two goals to nil at Selhurst, whilst a two nil victory was obtained over Gillingham on the Kent Club's ground. On the other side of the sheet however, they had to admit defeat at Southend by the overwhelming score of seven goals to one, and on Monday evening last, whilst we were gaining our initial victory at the expense of Queens Park Rangers, our visitors were being beaten by the "Cobblers" by three goals to one.

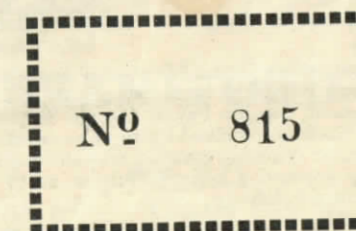
Of their last season's teams the Palace retained no fewer than twenty of their players, although during the summer months their goal scoring centre forward, Peter Simpson, was transferred to West Ham United. To these have been added, Booth from Margate, Crompton from Clapton Orient, Hanson from Wolverhampton Wanderers, Reeve from Ashford, Newell from Leytonstone, Read from

Grimsby, and Comrie, Waterfield and Smith from Burnley. These latter three players were doubtless brought to Selhurst at the instigation of the "Glaziers" new manager, Mr. T. G. Bromilow, who succeeded Mr. Jack Tresadern when the latter relinquished the position to take over the reins of Tottenham Hotspur.

Last season our home game with the Palace, owing to our engagement at Burnley in the Cup, had to be played in mid-week and a draw of two goals each resulted, but the "Glaziers" had obtained the odd goal in three in the previous match at Selhurst Park.

We are presenting at each match, to two holders of programmes, a ticket which will enable them to obtain free admission to the Grand Stand at the following match (Cup Ties and Special Matches excepted) that is to be played on this ground.

A board will be taken round the ground during the interval intimating the numbers that have been selected, and holders, who have in their possession programmes bearing these numbers, are requested to make personal application at the office of the Club immediately after the termination of the match, in order to claim these tickets.



CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

Yes, it was bound to come sooner or later, but what is most disappointing to us all is that we had to play six games before it did occur. Perhaps now we have started we shall keep it up. Let us sincerely hope so.

The Rangers provided us with our initial victory of the campaign on Monday evening last. Those of us who have seen all the games at home so far this season, will recognise that in this match our visitors had a larger percentage of the game than either of our two former opponents, also provided us with a much more thrilling game, and yet in spite of this were the losers, whilst Southend and Bournemouth were able to collect points. It is true our boys seemed more at home, there was much more liveliness in the attack, and we saw more than twice as many shots at goal than in all the previous five matches put together. If we wish to compare our football with that of last season, we cannot yet say that we have found a perfect combination. This may, however, perhaps still come as the season advances, but we can say we have found a combination with that extra little bit of "devil" in it.

The early stages of the game were remarkable for a series of four "corner kicks" from George Kidd. Each of these throws could easily have been turned into account, but only one, the second, did prove successful, Frank Beresford nodding the ball into the net, and so allowing us to obtain a lead for the first time this season. After this several onslaughts were made on the Rangers' goal, but Mason was in great form, saving a carpet cross shot from George Turner and making a miraculous save from a brilliant shot by Colin Cook. In the meantime the Rangers were by no means inactive and several promising movements proved to be very dangerous, but fortunately Joe Coen was in good form. The interval arrived without any further addition to the score. On the resumption rain began to fall somewhat heavily, and the light became none too good. The standard of play was, however, maintained and there was a big thrill when Fletcher forced his way through, shooting brilliantly for Joe Coen to make a magnificent save. This seemed to be the turning point in the game for afterwards the Rangers hardly had a look in. Our forwards literally bombarded their goal, George Turner often evoking applause by his endeavours to increase the lead. It was due to him that we did obtain our second goal, for following good play on the right wing Mark Crook put the ball right across goal. The Rangers defence had been drawn out of position, but Mason left his charge and fell at the feet of Turner as he rushed in to meet the ball. The goalkeeper however could not gather the ball properly and it rolled to the feet of George Stephenson who put it into an empty net. Almost on the stroke of time a movement on the left resulted in a centre, but before Mark Crook could put the ball into the net for the third time the final whistle had sounded.

On Tuesday evening we took a team to Biggleswade and played a friendly game with the local club. A very enjoyable game resulted in a victory for us by seven goals to three, the scorers being Andrews 2, Thayne 2, Finlayson, Ball and Crompton.

Today we entertain the "Glaziers," but what the final composition of the team will be is not known at the moment, for Joe Payne, George Stephenson and Colin Cook all received leg injuries of one kind or another, on Monday evening, and although they are rapidly improving a final decision as to their fitness is not yet definite.

The Reserves travel to Southend, and it is to be hoped they will maintain their winning form.

On Wednesday next we entertain Brentford Reserves and a special good game is expected. We congratulate most heartily the Brentford Club on their gaining First Division status. May they continue in this sphere for many years to come. The Kick-Off has been arranged for 5-30 p.m. which is as late as we can start in order that the match can be finished in decent light.

On Wednesday next also we journey to Swindon to fulfil our Southern Section Cup Fixture. For those supporters who intend making the journey, the Kick-Off has been fixed for 6 p.m.

Thomas Reed (goalkeeper) Height—6 ft. Weight—12 st. Was first discovered by Stockport County, but went to Grimsby Town the next season. Secured by Palace this season.

A. E. Haynes (right full back) Height—6 ft. Weight—11 st. 8 lb. Secured by the Arsenal from Oxford City seven seasons ago. Remained at Highbury for five seasons before being transferred to Crystal Palace two years ago.

Oswald Parry (left full back) Height—5 ft 11½ in. Weight—11 st. 5 lb. A Welshman who was the Wimbledon pivot when discovered by the Palace. Has now developed as a full back.

William Turner (right half back) Height—5 ft. 6½ in. Weight—11 st. 7 lb. One of the "Glaziers'" long service men, being signed as far back as 1925. Originally a right winger, but has played in every position except goal.

William Wilde (centre half back) Height—6 ft. 1 in. Weight—12 st. 9 lb. Was seen when playing for the Army team and was persuaded to don the Palace jersey as an amateur until his Army service had expired. Has been a regular member of their team now for six seasons.

William S. Smith, (left half back) Height—5 ft. 7½ in. Weight—11 st. Transferred to the Palace from Brentford two seasons ago. Native of South Shields.

James Carson (outside right) Height—5 ft. 6 in. Weight—11 st. 4 lb. A Scotchman who previously played for Bradford Park Avenue. Came to Selhurst last season.

William G. Goodliffe (centre forward) An amateur who assists the "Glaziers" at frequent intervals. Has scored many goals for Dulwich Hamlet. Played at Northampton on Monday evening last.

Frank Manders (inside right) Height—5 ft. 10 in. Weight—11 st. 10 lb. A Londoner by birth but his first Club was Aldershot for whom he played when sixteen years of age. Signed by the Palace the following season.

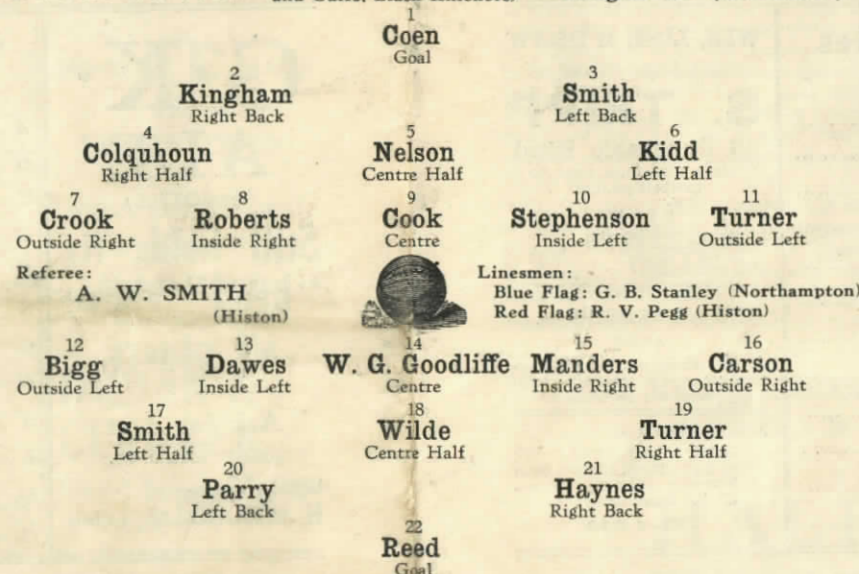
