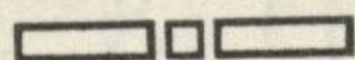

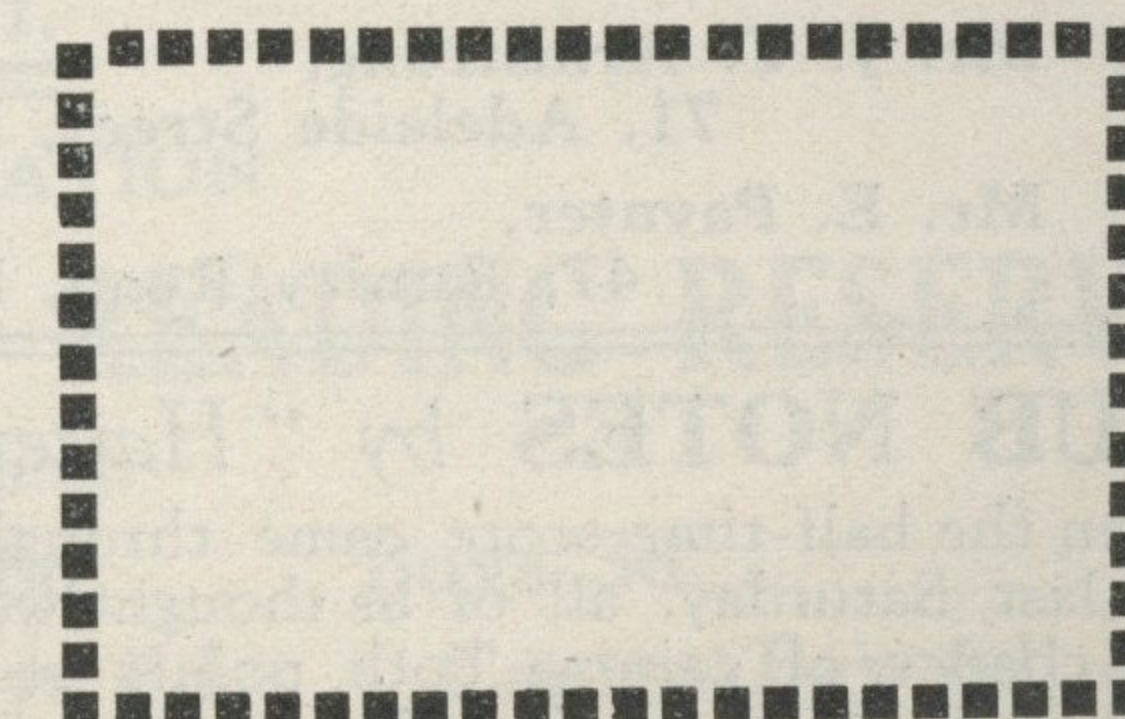

1. When did it happen that two noted League teams in the course of fulfilling an F.A. Cup Tie, met on two grounds in each city?
2. Which contemporary player scored in his Football League debut, which he did not make until nine years after he first joined a League Club?
3. When did it happen that a player actually turned out to appear in a First Division match, sustained a fracture before it began, and did not play in the game at all, another player being brought in?
4. Nine players, all discovered by a Second Division Club in minor football, all became English Internationals, but only one of them did so, while in the service of that particular club. Can you supply the facts?

Here are the Answers

1. Sheffield United and Nottingham Forest were drawn in the first round in season 1922/3 and played a draw on each club's ground. A third meeting was decided on Notts County's ground that also being drawn, and a fourth game was played at Sheffield Wednesday's home, United winning 1-0.
2. Albert Green, an inside left, first became a professional with a Football League club when Sheffield Wednesday signed him in season 1926/7, but it was not until the first day of this season that he made his League debut and then he scored a goal for Lincoln City against Accrington Stanley.
3. While the Bradford City players were "kicking in" prior to the First Division game against Sheffield United at Bramall Lane on Monday evening, September 6th 1920, William Hibbert took a shot at goal, and immediately fell to the ground. Carried off, he was found to have broken a small bone just above the ankle, and Waddell, a reserve, was brought into the side for the match.
4. Richard Downs, Thomas Boyle, Frank Barson, George Utley, John Mordue, Ernest Hine, Russell Wainscoat, George Wall and Eric Brook all were discovered by Barnsley, and all became English Internationals, but Utley was the only one of them who did so before he left Barnsley.

George Martin christened his return to the game, after being off for three weeks on account of injury, with a hat trick and the other two goals were added by Colin Cook and Joe Payne, both first class shots.

On Thursday afternoon the "Stiffs" played the return game at Brentford and a very fine game eventually resulted in their second defeat by the narrow margin of four goals to three. Brentford opened the score midway through the first half, but ten minutes from the interval Ron. Stevens neutralised this advantage, and at the change over the score was one all. The first five minutes after the resumption was a disastrous period for us for the "Bees" scored two further goals and fifteen minutes from the end added a fourth. In a great final rally Wilf Crompton and George Martin reduced the arrears and a great shot from Colin Cook narrowly missed bringing an equaliser.
