

We always welcome the visit of our Seaside friends, and the renewal of acquaintances and reminiscences is always of a pleasant exchange.

Brighton have shown rather in and out form so far this season and on Saturday last were defeated at home by Bournemouth by the only goal scored. On a previous occasion, however, they defeated Newport County (who accounted for Watford so handsomely on Saturday last) by the mammoth score of seven goals to one. This shows them to be a team of surprises. Let us hope they do not spring one such today.

The Albion retained 16 of their last season's players and newcomers to their ranks include, E. C. Beecham, goalkeeper, previously with Queens Park Rangers and Fulham, H. J. Stephens and W. R. Bellamy, extreme wingers from Brentford and Tottenham Hotspur respectively, G. Clarke from Portsmouth, W. Richards from Fulham, A. Law from Sheffield Wednesday, T. Prest from Burnley, and

T. McCarthy from Dundee.

Last season at Luton on Christmas Day we defeated Brighton by four clear goals, but on the Boxing Day, Brighton were successful by four goals to one.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

"It was a glorious victory." Hearty congratulations to the boys on their splendid win at Gillingham last Saturday. It is very inspiring and let us hope it marks the dawn of a more successful era. The victory is all the more gratifying for Gillingham can be counted as a force this season, as their two away victories on the two previous Saturdays at the expense of Bournemouth and Exeter City amply emphasises. Not dismayed, Reading put on pressure and the lead was diminished by one, but not for long however, as in an attack on the "Biscuiters" goal, Harold Andrews was fouled in the fated area and Colin Cook had no difficulty in registering his hat trick. The interval arrived without any further addition to the score. The second half was a repetition of the first, although goals were fewer, the only point during this period being notched by our visitors, although our boys had their chances, only to fail through over eagerness.

On Wednesday last the "Stiffs" visited Bristol City and a good game ended in each side scoring twice. The conditions were terrible, an hour prior to the kick-off a drizzle began which continued for practically the whole duration of the game. Accordingly the ground was very treacherous and greasy making footholds very precarious. The City were one up after five minutes play, a beautiful header from Wallis finding a billet, but six minutes later Frank Beresford equalised, taking a quick return pass from Ron Stevens and catching the Bristol defence napping. Bristol went ahead after twenty-five minutes, a misunderstanding allowing Wallis to get in a shot, which, however, would have gone outside, but for it hitting Hubbard in transit.

Eight minutes after the resumption George Turner had an easy chance to head through following a perfect centre from Ron Stevens. Each team had chances in the final stages, but the final whistle blew with the score two all—a very fair result.


