

OUR visitors today should again receive a welcome from their Welsh compatriots at Luton, for it is Newport County who provide the opposition.

The County, during the past few years, have always been most difficult to overcome and although, as yet, they have not been successful in a League game here since the War, they have given us shocks, bad ones at times and have shared the spoils on two occasions in the last three years. Even last term, although the final score was 4-1 in our favour we had to fight hard in order to gain this ascendancy.

This season it appears that they have maintained their reputation as a team of surprises for on two occasions, at Coventry and at Brighton, they succumbed by the mammoth scores of seven goals to one, whilst at Watford they beat our neighbours by five goals to two and inflicted a reverse of two goals to one on Bristol City at the Ashton Gate Ground.

A familiar figure is missing from the Newport Club this season, for in place of Mr. James Hindmarsh the reins of management have fallen on to the shoulders of Mr. Louis Page, who will be remembered as the old Northampton player and later, manager of Yeovil and Petters United.

Newcomers to the "Ironside" ranks are Briggs, a goalkeeper previously with Swansea Town, Kelso and Jenkins, full backs from Port Vale and Bristol City, and in the middle line, Craven and Helsby from Port Vale and Hull City respectively.

Of the forwards, D. Jones hails from Cardiff City, Parle from Mr. Page's old Club, Yeovil and Petters United, Smith and McKay from Bristol Rovers, whilst White was obtained from Coventry City.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

The first team accomplished a splendid performance in bringing back both points from Exeter, a performance more superb than a majority of us perhaps realise. When a club is having such a bad run as the "Grecians," and especially as they had previously lost four matches at home, the players become really desperate and go to superhuman lengths in order to turn the tide. If for this alone, great credit must be bestowed on our boys on their victory, but, and this is all the more sweeter, they thoroughly deserved their success, for they gave a brilliant exhibition and with a little more accuracy would have made the margin much wider. The impression must not, however, be gained that Exeter were a poor side. Far from it, for they displayed excellent football, which was not at all in keeping with their position at the foot of the table. Councillor Jeyes was in charge of our party and I have been informed that when he opened the dressing room door after the conclusion of the match in order to congratulate the lads, his face was wreathed in smiles which was compared with the "rising sun" and the Japanese National Flag. Such are the sweets of victory.

Jack Ball gave us an early lead when he took advantage of a faulty clearance by Chesters and this proved the only score at the interval, although other chances on both sides presented themselves. Exeter equalised after ten minutes of the second half when Tom Mackey slipped on the treacherous ground (it had rained every day of the week at Exeter) and Ebdon shot the ball into the net as Coen came out. A ding-dong struggle now ensued but fifteen minutes later a brilliant movement on the left ended with a perfect pass from George Stephenson, and Wilf Crompton scored a second

goal, which ultimately proved to be the deciding point. End to end play followed, but what chances offered themselves were in our favour and with a less capable custodian than Chesters the margin would have been greater. To say that any one of our lads was more outstanding than another would be superfluous for all played exceedingly well, and played together as a team should do. Tom Mackey has regained his form that made him so outstanding in past Cup Ties, and Jack Ball too has somewhat regained his activities which made him such a dangerous customer to be up against last season.

The "Stiffs" did exceedingly well against West Ham Reserves and were successful by five goals to two. They thoroughly merited their victory for they gave a splendid exhibition especially in the opening half. In this match a trial was given to W. J. Wakeling, a left full back from Ilford, and he played exceptionally well in the first half, although doubtlessly the pace of the match took toll on him afterwards. Beresford opened the scoring early in the game following a "corner kick" from George Kidd, and before half time George Turner had completed a hat trick. During the second half Beresford brought the total to five, but the "Hammers" replied with a couple from Peter Simpson.

On Monday we entertain Cambridge University and the kick-off is 3 p.m. In this match a further trial will be given W. J. Wakeling, whilst on view also will be Maurice Dinsdale, an inside right who has been playing with West Auckland, a Durham club. One or two other youngsters of repute may appear in our colours but nothing further, at the moment, can definitely be said.

The kick-off on Saturday next, against Leicester Reserves is at 2.45 p.m.


