WELCOME today to our old "enemies" Swindon Town. The Railwaymen have always provided us with stern struggles and the game today is not expected to be of a variation from them.

At Swindon our opponents have yet to lose a match although they have on three occasions, against Bristol City, Exeter City and Queens Park Rangers been forced to share the spoils. Away from home they have provided shocks at Aldershot whom they defeated by three goals to one and at Brighton when they were successful by two clear goals and in their other games they have been defeated only by the narrowest of margins, the three goals scored against them at Gillingham being the highest recorded in an individual match.

Few of last seasons players were retained but notabilities such as Duckworth, Armstrong, Peters, Fowler and Bowl are still with them. Their list of newcomers include J. Rutherford a goalkeeper last season with West Ham United, and in the full back positions T. McCarthy (Queens Park Rangers) A. J. Smith (Bristol Rovers) and H. Bailey (Leeds United). The half back line has been strengthened with the addition of R. Shanks and S. Wilcockson, both from Leeds United whilst in the forward line there are "Shadow" Wells and A. Cochrane from Northampton,

J. Parmley from Huddersfield, S. H. Lowry from Swansea Town and A. Vaughan from Cardiff City.

We have already met our Swindon friends this season for in a Southern Section Cup Match at the Wiltshire town in September the Railwaymen were successful by five goals to three.

## CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

Saturday last was a very day for jubilation for not only did the "Stiffs" defeat Leicester by the big score of six goals to one but the first team accomplished the very fine performance of defeating our rivals at Watford on the Vicarage Road ground by three goals to one. This now makes five consecutive victories off the reel, three of which have been on opponents grounds. What a remarkable contrast to the results at the commencement of the season. There must have been at least 5000 of our supporters at Watford and consequently the "gate" at Luton was the smallest Saturday attendance so far this season. I have yet to meet a supporter who gives me a bad report of the Watford game, or anyone, come to that, who has informed me that we were fortunate to win. All say that the spoils went to the best eleven and were exceedingly pleased with the display of the whole of the team. If anyone was signalled out for special mention it was Jack Nelson. The big centre half is climatising himself more every match to the conditions and tactics of Southern Section football and there is no doubt he is speedily winning over his critics of the earlier part of the season.

Watford won the toss, but our boys were soon prominent, and after six minutes, following a clearance by Fellowes, the ball came to Roberts who transferred to Crompton for the winger to crash the ball home. The boys kept up the offensive for some considerable time and the Watford defence had several anxious times, McLaren especially being prominent ere they were able to clear their lines. As the interval approached Watford made strenuous efforts to cross over on level terms but so formidably did our halves and backs defend that Coen was not seriously troubled. On the resumption the forwards again stormed the Watford citadel and McLaren was seen at his best. As the game neared to the close Fred Roberts obtained our second goal and shortly afterwards Jack Ball added a third whilst almost from the kick off Lane obtained Watford's solitary point although Findlay shot wide a minute afterwards from a penalty kick for a decision against Mackey, which our boys strongly disputed.

The "Stiffs" entertained Leicester City Reserves and won comfortably by six goals to one. Here again it would be suicidal to emphasise one player as superior to his colleague for all played well. Leicester won the toss and their approach work in the opening stages was reminiscent of that of Newport County the week previous. However the "Stiffs" gradually obtained the supremacy and

following good work by Turner, Cook headed a good goal. He repeated this again shortly afterwards. In the second half the "Stiffs" ran riot and Bill Thayne again showed his aptitude for goals and completed the hat trick, the other point being obtained by Beresford who capped a brilliant afternoon's work with the best goal of the match—a brilliant shot from thirty yards out which hit the rigging at such a speed that it rebounded back into play.

Today we entertain Swindon Town, old rivals of many a Southern League encounter, and the team for the sixth week remains unchanged. The "Stiffs" visit Coventry and have a "stiff" task in front of them for the Bantams are literally hot-stuff on their own enclosure. The team to do duty will be the same as played against Leicester City on Saturday last.

Saturday next marks the big attraction of the Reserve Calendar, for we receive a visit from the Arsenal. Will the record Reserve attendance of 6107 which they created last season be broken? **Supporters are asked to note that the time of the Kick-off will be 2-30 p.m.**

During the interval today we are being supplied with music by the Dagenham Girl Pipers. Since their visit some time ago this band has always been an attraction in Luton and I am sure their reception here this afternoon will equal that of former occasions.

On Monday evening next commencing at 7-30 p.m. the Directors and Players meet the Supporters at an Indoor Games Tournament at the Bobbers Stand Club. I am sure the Club will be crowded out.




