



IT would be impossible to have a more attractive match for a holiday game than that today when we entertain as our visitors Notts County. The Nottingham Club is the oldest in the country being formed in the year 1862.

The pioneers of Notts County gained their knowledge of football in Sheffield and in the first few years only a few matches were played. In the first game between Notts County and Notts Forest a mixture of Association and Rugby was played and in those days there was no crossbar to the goalposts.

For a time the County were not so successful as the Forest, but in 1875 they were invited to visit Glasgow to meet the then world famous Queens Park.

The year 1881 was a very serious one for the Club, but owing to the splendid efforts of Mr. Arthur Ashwell it was able to continue.

They were tenants of Trent Bridge in 1881, and while they occupied the ground it became one of the greatest homes of Association football. The following year they were in the semi final of the F. A. Cup and six members of the team were internationals against Scotland. At that period they were looked upon as one of the most powerful sides in the country, but while great efforts were made to retain amateur status they changed to professionalism in 1885-6.

Then followed a lean time but in 1888 they were invited to join the English League. The club was then reconstructed and registered as a Limited Company with the late Mr. A. Williams as Chairman.

In 1891 they secured third place in the League and in the same year reached the final of the F. A. Cup. Three years later they went one better and the Cup was brought to Nottingham.

The season 1905 was a bad one but owing to the League taking in two additional clubs the County retained their status.

One of the most famous players ever associated with the Club was Albert Iremonger who played in approximately 700 League games during his twenty two years service.

This season the County found themselves relegated to the Third Division and under the management of Mr. Percy Smith are making a determined effort to regain their lost status.

We are presenting at each match, to two holders of programmes, a ticket which will enable them to obtain free admission to the Grand Stand at the following match (Cup ties and Special Matches excepted) that is to be played on this ground.

A board will be taken round the ground during the interval intimating the numbers that have been selected, and holders, who have in their possession programmes bearing these numbers, are requested to make personal application at the office of the Club immediately after the termination of the match, in order to claim these tickets.
