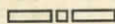

It can be truthfully said that the present directors of the Clapton Orient Club can be classified under this category and they can be warmly congratulated on the results they have so far attained this season. Here is wishing them the best of luck in the future.

At the Lea Bridge Road Ground the "Os" have had a truly remarkable run of success for it was not until their seventh game that they had a goal scored against them, yet alone dropping a point. Curious though it may seem, the first Club to find the net there took away both points and what is more surprising still is that that Club was Exeter City, who had been for weeks previous repeatedly tasting of the dregs of defeat. Such is the way of soccer.

Owing to their poor financial position at the end of last season, the Orient found it impossible to retain but a skeleton staff during the summer months, and most of their signings were accomplished within only a week or two before the season opened. These players were secured as follows: Hurst from Blackpool, Affleck from Bristol City, Pateman from Bradford City, Heinemann from Crystal Palace,

Paget from Torquay, Ried from Crystal Palace, Trodd from Queens Park Rangers, Woods from Southend United and Campbell from Glasgow Rangers.

The "O's" inflicted upon us a severe defeat in the match at Lea Bridge Road. Let us hope we turn the tables here today.

2. When Patrick Corcoran, an outside right, was transferred from Bathgate (Scotland) to Plymouth Argyle in October 1920 he was succeeded in the Bathgate team by David Robbie, who, after a long spell with Bury, joined Plymouth last July, and who is with Manchester United now.

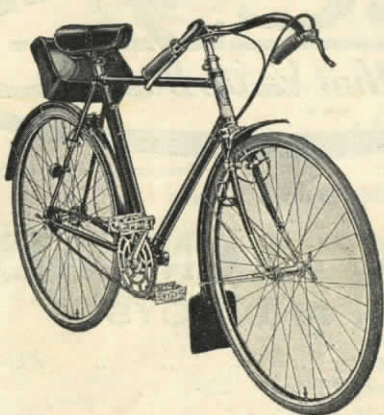
