CLUB GOSSIP. BATTLES WITH LUTON THAT LED TO THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

WE should like to pay our modest but sincere tribute to the great loss the nation and the Empire have sustained by the death of King George.

His Majesty was a patron of the Football Association and in addition to attending two of our Cup Finals, he conferred upon us the great honour of visiting our old ground at Hyde Road on the occasion of our League match with Liverpool on March 27, 1920. It was the first time he had ever been present at a match in the provinces.

OLD TIMES RECALLED.

THE Cup often brings strange playmates, and so far as the national competition is concerned,

we are meeting new opponents this afternoon.

As Cup fighters we have never met Luton Town before, and we have never had the pleasure of entertaining them at this ground in any game, but as clubs we are not strangers.

We ran up against them in our young days in the League. When we were in the Second Division we met them on four occasions, and we beat them each time.

The first meeting was at Luton, on New Year's Day, 1898, when we won by three clear goals, and in the return game at Hyde Road the following March we prevailed by 2-1. We finished third





OUR CUP RIVALS.

LANCASHIRE PLAYERS IN THE LUTON TOWN TEAM.

WE take the liberty of reproducing the following snapshots of the Luton Town players from last Saturday's *Football Chronicle*, to which we have added the birthplace, heights, and weights:

JOSEPH COEN (goalkeeper).—Is a native of Glasgow, and was employed in the shipyards until signing for Clydewall as a professional. He played for Celtic, Guildford City, and Boscombe before joining Luton two seasons ago, after giving a brilliant display against them in a Southern Section match. Height, 5ft. 8½ins. Weight, 12st.

T. S. MACKEY (right full-back).—Had three seasons at Hillsborough following a spell with Hartlepools United as a centre half-back. He can play on the left, if necessary. Born Durham. Height, 5ft. 10in. Weight, 12st.

T. S. SMITH (left full-back).—Is a school teacher from Higham, for which club he played prior to putting in two seasons with Rochdale and playing some football while studying at the Leeds Training College. Lancashire lad fro' Burnley. Height, 5ft. 9½ins. Weight, 11st. 7lbs.

JACK FINLAYSON (right half-back).—A Scot, from Renfrew, who played for a local Thornlebank club and later for Motherwell and Cowdenbeath. His full-back displays for Clapton Orient last season attracted Luton "spotters," who have since converted him into a most capable wing half-back. Height, 5ft. 10½in. Weight, 11st. 7lbs.

J. NELSON (centre half-back).—He can, indeed, be called the pivot and guiding-star of the side. A native of Chorley, where he worked in the cotton mills. But for the slump he might have refused Preston's offer to turn professional. From Deepdale he went to Wolverhampton Wanderers, to whom Luton paid a big fee for his transfer. As cool as the proverbial cucumber. Height, 6ft. 1½ins. Weight, 12st.

W. FELLOWES (left half-back).—Like his colleagues on the opposite flank, is an acquisition from Clapton Orient, for whom he used to play at centre half-back. A Yorkshireman from Bradford. Height, 5ft. 9ins. Weight, 12st.

WILF CROMPTON (outside right).—Another Lancastrian. Comes of real footballing stock, his father being none other than the famous "Bob" Crompton. Played for Blackburn Rovers, Burnley, and for a short time with Gillingham. He is a motor mechanic. Height, 5ft. 8ins. Weight, 11st.

G. MARTIN (inside right).—Hails from Glasgow and played in Scottish football for Hamilton Academicals before arriving at Luton four years ago via Hull, Everton, and Middlesbrough. Height, 5ft. 9ins. Weight 10st. 10lbs.

JACK BALL (centre forward).—Well known in Manchester and the North generally. A native of Southport. Has played for several clubs, including Southport, Manchester United, Sheffield Wednesday, and Huddersfield Town. Well endowed physically, he is most difficult to move off the ball. Scored 30 League goals for Luton last season. Height, 5ft. 9½ins. Weight, 11st. 10lbs.

F. ROBERTS (inside left).—The first player secured when Luton decided to invest their Cup earnings in team building. Native of West Bromwich, he played for a works team and did so well that they got to hear about him at St. Andrew's. Birmingham parted with him to Luton about the middle of last season. Height, 5ft. 9ins. Weight, 11st.

G. STEPHENSON (outside left).—Had two seasons at Villa Park following a promising start to his career with Durham City. Comes from Stillington, Durham, and fears nothing. Height, 5ft. 9ins. Weight, 11st. 7lbs.




