

WE extend a very hearty welcome to our visitors from Reading today. Our relationship with the Berkshire Club has always been one of a cordial nature and we have always been assured of magnanimous hospitality when we have visited the town of Biscuit fame. Today it is our turn to reciprocate and, if it is possible, further extend our bonds of friendship.

Of late weeks the "Biscuiters" have had one or two nasty reverses which has severely hindered their Championship hopes. First of all Queens Park Rangers took away from them a record of an unbroken run of home victories of over two seasons, and only on Saturday last Bournemouth and Boscombe metaphorically added insult to injury by inflicting a second home defeat.

Since the "Biscuiters" visited us last season they have made a change in the personnel of their management and the reins of office have fallen on the shoulders of Mr. William Butler, whom many football followers will remember as the old Bolton Wanderers player. Mr. Butler has collected round him a versatile team, one of his acquisitions being Stanley Coote, the local Harpenden boy who was with us for two seasons until transferred to Reading earlier in the present season. Two other of the Berkshire Club players who need no introduction to us are Albert Hayhurst and Tom Tait, and we shall be pleased to see them once again. Both are big favourites with the Reading supporters.

Newcomers this season to Reading include Mapson, a young goalkeeper of great promise from Highworth, a Wiltshire Club, whilst the full back division has

been strengthened by the inclusion of R. Done who was previously on Liverpool's books.

In the forward line, new faces are T. Briggs previously with Rotherham, C. F. Keetley from Bradford City and J. Paterson from Leicester City. When they visited us last season Reading took away with them the spoils, being victors by four goals to two after we had led at one period by two goals to nil, whilst in the match at Reading earlier this season our visitors scored two goals in the last ten minutes which not only neutralised our first half score but also gave them the supremacy. We expect today a ding dong struggle, for the "Biscuiters" will be all out to retrieve their recent failures and at the same time not only brighten their own championship hopes but also put a check to our own. However may the best team win.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

Well, our Cup record this season finished last Saturday at Manchester when the City inflicted a two goals to one defeat on us, but I venture to suggest that not one of the 65,978 spectators present, will admit that the best team won.

It was another thrilling game, the football being positively brilliant, and especially so considering the ground conditions, indeed the Manchester press pay us the compliment of producing the best game at Maine Road this season and this, considering the personnel of the teams that do provide the opposition there, is one of which to be exceedingly proud. At the conclusion of the game, Mr. Smith, the City Chairman, accompanied by Mr. Wild, the manager, visited our dressing room and in a pleasant little speech heartily congratulated our boys on their brilliant showing. He also added that he considered they were very unlucky losers. Now about the players themselves, needless to say they were extremely disappointed at the result and to quote George Martin "We should not mind if we had been beaten by a better team" give one some idea of their feelings. However they cheered up a little on the journey home, when the "victory" cigar was handed round. To individualise on the performance of any player in this match would be excessive, all played splendidly, meeting skill with skill, and anticipation with anticipation, so much so that but for the extreme brilliance of Swift in the City goal a lead of three goals would have been established before half-time. Yes, Manchester have a lot for which to thank Swift. Some of his saves bordered on the miraculous. When the City scored after a

quarter of an hour of the second half had elapsed, the point was quite against the run of play and not a few considered that Herd was in an offside position when he received the ball. Eight minutes from the end after a heavy period of pressure by our forwards Toseland broke away on the Manchester right and from his centre McLeod scored a real opportunist goal. Straight from the restart we broke away on the left and after a continuous stream of shots had been blocked the ball came to George Martin who reduced the City's lead. From now until the final whistle blew the boys tried every ounce for an equaliser, but it was not to be, and they retired, in my opinion, unworthy losers. Such are the fortunes of war.

The match at Crystal Palace on Wednesday last, provided us with our first League defeat since September 28th, when we lost to Reading. Whilst agreeing that the Palace won deservedly, the score of 5 goals to 1 was rather flattering. Our boys put up a good show, but were somewhat leg-weary after the strenuous match at Manchester. The Palace had only a friendly game with Millwall on the Saturday previous, and were that fraction quicker on the ball which made all the difference. The home team were three goals up in the first quarter of an hour, but from thence until the interval we had practically all the game but could obtain no score, mainly through the brilliance of Dunn. After the interval the Palace added two further goals, whilst Jack Ball reduced the deficit with a good header following a fine run and centre from George Stephenson.
