



GILLINGHAM are our visitors today and to the Kent Club we extend a very hearty welcome on their visit to Hatopolis.

Our visitors have quite a useful record so far this season, and are having, so far as one can presume, one of the most successful seasons for a large number of terms. Their "away" record is exceedingly good for they have defeated Aldershot by two clear goals, Bournemouth by the odd goal in three, Exeter City by five goals to two and Watford by two goals to one beside making drawn games at Brighton and Crystal Palace of one goal each, sharing six goals at Notts County and participating in a goalless game at Northampton. If their home record had been intact they would have indeed been serious contenders for the title but lapses against Bournemouth, Crystal Palace, Northampton and ourselves have taken the shine off their visiting performances. Nevertheless the fact remains their record shows them to be a team of no mean calibre and if we are to complete the double at their expense, we must give no quarter at any time during the game.

Financial matters have for several years been an acute question with Kent Club, consequently the retention and acquisition of players has always called for rare tact on the part of the management, and, if for this alone, they are to be congratulated on their good choice. To the seven players retained have been added W. Ballson a full back from Tunbridge Wells Rangers, and the intermediate line has been strengthened by the acquisition of G. Pybus from Chelsea, R. Dann from Blackpool and J. Turton from West Bromwich Albion, whilst in the forward line new faces are G. Tadman from Bristol City T. Duncan from Blackburn Rovers, J. Fisher from Swindon Town and W. Watson from Northampton.

As has been previously mentioned when we visited Gillingham in October last we were successful by the only goal of the match, the teams appearing that day as follows: Gillingham:- Whitelaw; Rossitter, Lester; Randle, Barrie, Hopkins; L. Balcombe, Fisher, Baldwin, Watson, Doncaster.

The boys accomplished another fine performance on Saturday last when they gained another two points at the expense of Cardiff City, thus making their seventh victory on foreign soil. Another result of this performance, accompanied by the helping hand of our neighbours at Watford, was to place us once again at the head of the table with a two points lead and a game in hand. Well done lads. Keep it up. Previous to the match the boys enjoyed a well earned rest at Brighton, where they stayed from the Tuesday until the Friday before journeying to Cardiff. They were accompanied there by Messrs F. J. Andrews and E. Hugh Woods and from all accounts had a most enjoyable time. Anyhow Bill Fellowes on behalf of the players asked Mr. Woods to convey to the Directors their sincere appreciation of the Directors thoughtfulness in giving them the holiday. Whilst on this matter too, it behoves us to say a word of thanks to Mr. Charlie Webb, the Brighton & Hove Manager, for the very kind way he assisted in the arrangements not to mention the facilities he allowed us in the way of training at the Brighton ground. Thanks very much Charlie, we shall not forget it.

The game at Cardiff had a sensational opening for Bill Boyd seemed a certain scorer when he was hooked up just outside the penalty area and it was only poetic justice that George Stephenson's pile driving "free" should open our account. Midway through the half George Martin gave Bill Boyd an opening and the centre by deft movements steered clear of the opposition and registered number two. Two or three minutes before the interval however Cardiff reduced the arrears, Jack Nelson slipped on the frost bound ground and Williams seized the

opportunity and scored, the ball glancing in off the post. With the commencement of the second half, Cardiff assumed the aggression, but their enthusiasm and over eagerness was their downfall and Joe Coen was never seriously troubled. Then came a delightful movement by all our forwards, the passing and interpassing being brilliant and so Bill Boyd registered number three. For a time now it was nearly all Luton but eight minutes from the end Cardiff had a breakaway, which found our defence speadeagled and Williams again reduced the lead. With excitement intense and spurred on by the frenzied clamourings of the home supporters the homesters strived for an equaliser but our lads defended cleverly and the final whistle sounded without any further alteration to the score. As Mr. Woods aptly reported "We never looked like losing and with a bit luck we might easily have had half a dozen."

Congratulations too for the Reserves. Saturday's result over the Palace had the resemblance of old times, and it is to be hoped that the "Stiffs" have now got over their bad patch. A pleasing feature was the successful debut of Len Rich, who claimed two of the five goals scored, the others being registered by Joe Payne (two) from the inside right position and George Turner from the inside left berth. Well done "Stiffs" keep it up.

Today we entertain Gillingham and whilst we do hope to be victors, the boys do not forget that a match is never won until it is lost. Every game now will be a miniature cup-tie, but with the will to win anything can be accomplished. Here's wishing you the best boys.

The "Stiffs" are due at Reading, but at the time of writing the team has not been definitely selected.
