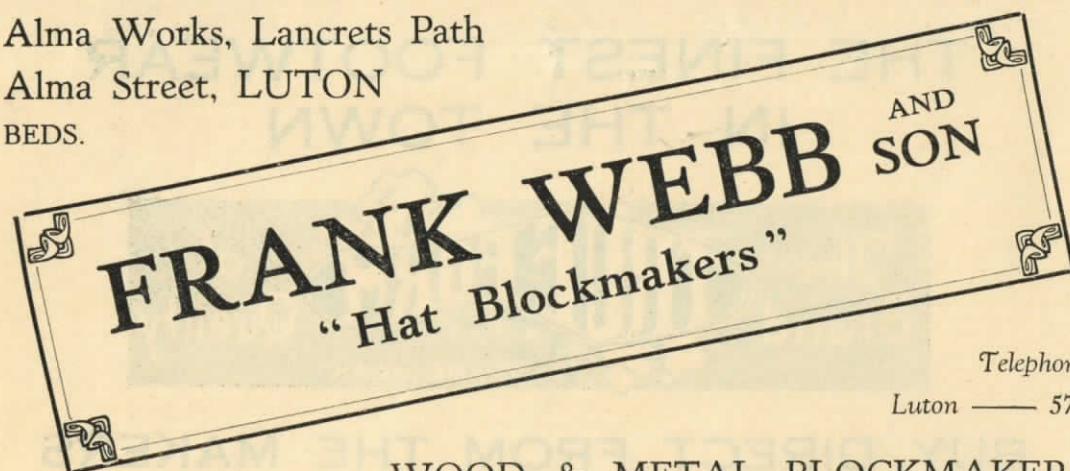

The cancellation of the remaining fixtures of all Clubs by the Football League in an endeavour to squash Pool betting, has resulted in our return game against Watford being played this afternoon. The knowledge of their visit, although of only short notice, does not make them any less welcome and we hope for a continuance of our keen needle matches. Perhaps there is no need to mention this because the position of the two clubs in the League table has every indication of a needle encounter, and with Watford making a faux pas last Saturday their endeavours will be all the more strenuous.

The "Wasps" finished sixth in the League table last term after at one period seeming serious contenders for the title role. The weakness in the team appeared to be in the forward line and in an attempt to remedy this they took a bold line in speculating on new men with the result that they secured T. J. Jones, a Welsh International outside right from Manchester United, L. Fletcher, a centre forward, and N. Wright, outside right from Manchester City, and T. C. Walters, an inside forward from Torquay United. In the intermediate line newcomers are E. Goodier, a centre half secured from Queens Park Rangers, and A. Greaves, a wing half back from Barnsley, whilst E. Morgan was a young Welsh amateur who, after a few games with the Reserves last season, was signed on professional forms.

Watford, this season, are a team of surprises; they will lose on their own ground one week and the next bring back

two points from foreign soil. Only last Saturday they allowed themselves to be defeated at home by Bristol Rovers after having scored three victories with a goal average of 16 for 1 against in the previous three games. Their team here today is as follows:—

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

It was a great performance of the boys on Saturday last, to force a drawn game at the Goldstone Road Ground and more especially so when one realises that they had only nine sound men with which to accomplish this result. It was exceedingly unfortunate for Wilf Crompton to sustain a leg injury after nearly half an hours play, for he was playing brilliantly and the team, as a whole, were reproducing that form which we saw during the Cup Ties. However Wilfred's knee gave out after he had kicked the ball from a free kick, and he was unable to take any further part in the game and I am afraid will be hors de combat for the remainder of the season, as it has assumed more serious proportions. Then there was Tom Smith. He was given a nasty kick on the leg and was a cripple for a large part of the game. Many players would have emphasised the seriousness of the injury, but not so Tom, he stuck to his guns manfully and never have we seen such a stout hearted performance, for in addition to his lameness he was knocked out with the ball on two other occasions. And now a word for the remainder of the team. They accustomed themselves to the circumstances manfully and would not budge one inch from their advantage. Joe Coen kept a great goal whilst Harold Booton made successful debut, Jack Nelson was a tower of strength at centre half and was ably supported by Bill Fellowes and Jock Finlayson. In the forward line Fred Roberts and George Martin had a strenuous day, first being in the forward line and then helping the defence, whilst George Stephenson and Bill Boyd did all that was asked of them and were serious thorns in the Brighton defence. You will notice that I have not mentioned anything about the Referee, Mr. W. J. Lewington. It is not my policy to criticise officials on their control of the game. All complaints by the Club on the conduct

of the game by officials is forwarded to the Football League, as has been done in this instance.

What were the "Stiffs" up to last Saturday? The team that they had out, was, on paper good enough for any Third Division side, but they allowed themselves to be beaten by the odd goal in seven by Millwall Reserves. It is true that the ground conditions were atrocious, the incessant rain during the morning having turned the pitch into a veritable quagmire, and also that Joe Payne received an injury during the first half, which interfered with the formation of the forward line for the remainder of the game, but notwithstanding all this they had chances that should have produced a hatful of goals, but the shooting was badly at fault. The defence too was uncertain Reg Kingham being easily beaten on numerous occasion whilst "Chick" McIntosh gave away at least one goal. Now then "Stiffs" this won't do. Let us see what you can do today at West Ham.

I have just learned our opponents for Saturday. My! what a match! The visit of the Herts Club is always the one which is most eagerly looked forward to in the League calendar and this season we may expect an unusually thrilling game. The Wasps lost at home last Saturday. I do not like this, for they will more than redouble their efforts to lower our colours today. Here's hoping they do not, for we cannot afford to drop any more points at this stage.

We only make one change for the match and that is a forced one, and so Len Rich gets his chance at outside right. Good luck, Len. Tom Smith has recovered from his injury, so will be on view at left back.

For the Reserve game at West Ham we are hoping to have a youngster on veiwi at outside right, but the team is indefinite at the moment.

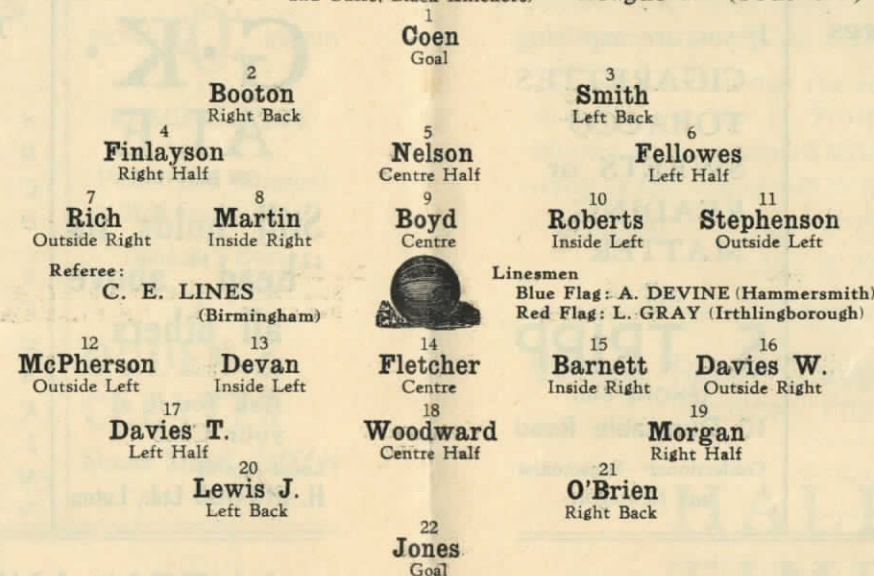
