

WE have for our visitors today, Exeter City, and we extend to them a hearty welcome on their presence here today.

The "Grecians" as they have been termed have not had a very successful season so far, and occupy at the moment position No. 21 in the League table. By this it will be seen that they will fight desperately in their remaining matches in order to avoid the necessity of having to apply for re-election at the season's end. We can therefore expect a ding-dong struggle here today without any quarter being given or received.

The City started the season with high hopes, for during the summer months of last year they spent many fees in the acquisition of new players in an endeavour to make a bid for promotion. Unfortunately their visions have ended awry. For the position of goalkeeper they secured C. Kirk who previously was with Liverpool, but a fortnight ago they secured the transfer of J. V. Beby, the Darlington custodian. In the full back division new players are Reginald Robinson previously with Huddersfield Town, Wynne Crompton formerly of Crystal Palace and W. Lowton from Wolverhampton Wanderers. The intermediate line was strengthened by the acquisition of J. T. Fantham from Blackpool, whilst in the vanguard new players are James Dunn from Everton, Thomas McLean from Blackburn Rovers, James McCambridge from Bristol Rovers and P. McArdle from Stoke City.

It is the "Grecians" home record that has failed them this season for they have succumbed on no fewer than eight occasions, whilst three other games have ended all square. They have one victory to their credit away from home at Lea Bridge Road where the "O's" were defeated by two goals to one whilst they effected drawn games at Bournemouth, Gillingham, Millwall, Northampton and Swindon.

At St. James Park last October we were successful by two goals to one. Our visitors therefore, will doubtless be all out today to retrieve this misfortune and we can expect a stern struggle.

## CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

It was a brilliant victory at Bristol against the City on Saturday last and our boys are to be congratulated most heartily on their splendid result. The City are no mean opponents as their record indicates and with the exception of Coventry and ourselves have had fewer goals recorded against them than any other club in our Division. It has only been their inability to get goals that has deterred them from obtaining a more advantageous position in the League table. We read continually in the daily press of Luton's luck away from home, so much so, that one becomes wearied of it. The reports on Saturday's game at Bristol give us as again fortunate to win so just by the way of a change I will give you here the context of a letter received by Bill Fellowes from a Bristol City supporter.

It was one of the cleanest and finest games we have had at Ashton Gate this season and as I always go to City matches to see the best team win, not the home team alone, and I should like to add that although there was a lot of do over the winning goal, I was in line, and as I have had considerable experience as a referee I say the goal was quite fair, the referee was right, Roberts our full back was to blame for that goal as he put your player inside. I do sincerely hope that next season will find Luton in the Second Division, for yours is a good clean sporting side and I could not let the chance slip of writing and telling you, as captain, so. I hope you will let the other players see this letter and that you will not slip up in the race for promotion. I shall certainly go out to Eastville when you play the Rovers and hope to enjoy another such game as on Saturday, but watch the Rovers centre Woodman, he is hot and a worrier, but I tell you this much, Bristol City should have had one penalty quite fair, but Mr. Whittle is a terrible referee and always is when he comes to Ashton, but I quite agreed with him although it was

against our home side, in the matter of the second goal which was as fair as any goal ever will be. Best of luck to you and all the Luton sports.

Frank Sloan had the pleasure of opening his initial account with two clever goals but the remaining forwards were rather off form. Nevertheless the two points were very welcome and the "Stiffs" gave an improved display from recent weeks. Let us hope they keep it up.

Today we have Exeter City as our visitors. The "Grecians" have had a very bad season this term and are now fighting desperately to avoid re-election. This being the case we can expect a usual cup tie battle. The team will be the same as that which played at Bristol on Saturday last.

The "Stiffs" journey to Leicester and a hard match is expected. McGinnigle resumes at centre half, Colin Cook goes to the extreme right and Dave Colquhoun gets a chance to show his paces as an inside forward, Bill Boyd takes the centre forward role and Ron Stevens appears on the extreme left.

Congratulations to Arthur Hubbard on the arrival of a young Hubbard. I hear mother and daughter are doing well. Well done Arthur. Carry on with the good work.

George Martin was one of a number of footballers who had an audition at the B.B.C. on Thursday evening. We might have a programme, contributed by footballers, over the air shortly.


