CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

It was a brilliant victory at Bristol against the City on Saturday last and our boys are to be congratulated most heartily on their splendid result. The City are no mean opponents as their record indicates and with the exception of Coventry and ourselves have had fewer goals recorded against them than any other club in our Division. It has only been their inability to get goals that has deterred them from obtaining a more advantageous position in the League table. We read continually in the daily press of Luton's luck away from home, so much so, that one becomes wearied of it. The reports on Saturday's game at Bristol give us as again fortunate to win so just by the way of a change I will give you here the context of a letter received by Bill Fellowes from a Bristol City supporter.

Being a sportsman and an old Bristol City supporter for many years, may I congratulate you and your team for the fine clean sporting game of football you gave versus Bristol City. It was one of the cleanest and finest games we have had at Ashton Gate this season and as I always go to City matches to see the best team win, not the home team alone, and I should like to add that although there was a lot of do over the winning goal, I was in line, and as I have had considerable experience as a referee I say the goal was quite fair, the referee was right, Roberts our full back was to blame for that goal as he put your player outside. I do sincerely hope that next season will find Luton in the Second Division, for yours is a good clean sporting side and I could not let the chance slip of writing and telling you, as captain, so. I hope you will let the other players see this letter and that you will not slip up in the race for promotion. I shall certainly go out to Eastville when you play the Rovers and hope to enjoy another such game as on Saturday, but watch the Rovers centre Woodman, he is hot and a worrier, but I tell you this much, Bristol City should have had one penalty quite fair, but Mr. Whittle is a terrible referee and always is when he comes to Ashton, but I quite agreed with him although it was

against our home side, in the matter of the second goal which was as fair as any goal ever will be. Best of luck to you and all the Luton sports.

I think the above speaks for itself and the match does not need any further comment from me.

Now for the "Stiffs." They are to be congratulated on their win over Swansea Reserves and the victory was well merited. A. E. Shotbolt the Biggleswade amateur had quite an easy time and had barely half a dozen shots at him during the whole of the match. Reg Kingham and Arthur Hubbard defended finely and gave an infinitely better exhibition than for many weeks previous. All three half backs played well and Bill Thayne was a rare spoiler. Up to the time of his injury Mark Crook was doing well but his old trouble asserted itself and he was forced to retire during the second half. Frank Sloan had the pleasure of opening his initial account with two clever goals but the remaining forwards were rather off form. Nevertheless the two points were very welcome and the "Stiffs" gave an improved display from recent weeks. Let us hope they keep it up.

Today we have Exeter City as our visitors. The "Grecians" have had a very bad season this term and are now fighting desperately to avoid re-election. This being the case we can expect a usual cup tie battle. The team will be the same as that which played at Bristol on Saturday last.

The "Stiffs" journey to Leicester and a hard match is expected. McGinnigle resumes at centre half, Colin Cook goes to the extreme right and Dave Colquhoun gets a chance to show his paces as an inside forward, Bill Boyd takes the centre forward role and Ron Stevens appears on the extreme left.

Congratulations to Arthur Hubbard on the arrival of a young Hubbard. I hear mother and daughter are doing well. Well done Arthur. Carry on with the good work.

George Martin was one of a number of footballers who had an audition at the B.B.C. on Thursday evening. We might have a programme contributed by footballers, over the air shortly.
