



WE extend a welcome today to Torquay United, the babies of the Third Division, who visit us to play off our League III encounter. This was originally arranged for January 18th last, but had to be postponed owing to our engagement with West Ham United in the F.A. Cup.

Torquay have had a fairly successful season so far this term and occupy a position in the higher half of the League table. But for the fact that they have only managed to collect five points away from home, they would certainly have been among the League leaders. Their only away victory was at Newport where they defeated the Ironsiders by the amazing score of six goals to one, but they have forced drawn games at Lea Bridge Road and The Den, sharing two goals, and at Watford, sharing four goals. Only one team has scored four goals against them, that being our conquerors of Saturday last, Swindon Town, and this fact alone speaks well of their defence. Three Clubs have succeeded in lowering their colours at Plainmoor these being Bournemouth by two clear goals, Millwall by three goals to one and Notts County by the only goal of the match whilst Coventry City, Northampton and Southend United have divided the points with them the two former Clubs sharing six goals and Southend sharing two goals.

The finances of the Devonshire Club have at no time been considerable and they do not receive that measure of support which their enterprise warrants consequently it is not surprising that they were only able to retain fifteen of their last season's players. Towards the end of the close season one or two new signatures were made being Thomas E. Davis a full back from Swansea, George Daniels from Stoke City and Harry Davies from Walsall, halfbacks, and to the vanguard Leslie Dodds from Hull City, Samuel Hunt from Mansfield Town and John Davie from the Hibernians. In February last they engaged with Birmingham in an exchange of forwards Albert Clarke joining the Midland Club

whilst John Beasley made the trek South.

Last season at Luton a very hard fight ended in a victory of three goals to one for us but in the return match at Plainmoor, Torquay returned the compliment by a victory of six goals to two. A hard game is expected today and we do not expect to receive any quarter from our visitors. Let us hope that the spoils go to the most deserving side.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

To say that we were disappointed on hearing the final result from Swindon last Saturday is to put it mildly, for with Coventry's victory over Notts County the Midland Club displace us from the leadership on goal average. With only ten matches remaining the fight gets more and more interesting but it already seems that if we are to be destined for Division II next season we must obtain one extra point than our Midland rivals for they have an infinitely better goal average than ourselves. However as I have repeatedly said before, the path to honours in football is a rough and stony one and during the whole of the climb we must not count our chickens before they are hatched.

To return to the game at Swindon, it was exceedingly unfortunate for us to lose Jack Ball after only fifteen minutes play for up to that period we had had practically all the game. It was an exceedingly bad foul that caused Jack's retirement, a kick on the back of the ankle, and it is to be regretted that the match was somewhat marred by over vigorous methods. After this unfortunate happening the forwards seemed somewhat lost, and

although practically throughout the match we had a slight balance of play, they proved ineffective in front of goal. Harry Gooney put up quite a good game on his initial appearance in the first team and Bill Fellowes proved a good deputy for Jack Nelson, who was unable to play owing to a strained neck. Anyhow let us hope they return to the winning path today.

Well done "Stiffs." It was a fine performance to score five goals without reply from Coventry, and your display during the first half of the game was a revelation but the second period was rather marred by the feeling that was allowed to creep into the game. Jack Hodge soon earned the approbation of the supporters and had the satisfaction of scoring in his first game, whilst Bill Dolman has not had his citadel shattered. Good lads. Keep it up.

Today we entertain Torquay United. The Devonshire team is one of surprises and although they have not a very good away record, that is something they can always improve on. Do you remember when they defeated us here by two goals to one in 1928/9 season and absolutely put paid to our promotion chances then? I do, and hope a similar thing does not happen today.


