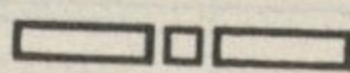

FOR the second of our holiday fixtures we entertain another old rival of Southern League days, Millwall, and to them we extend a very cordial welcome. Many have been the tussles between us in the past with the fortunes always fluctuating, first Millwall being able to claim the ascendancy and then ourselves dispossessing them of that honour. And so today we have a renewal of our conflicts and doubtless the "Lions" will be all determined to neutralise the drawn goalless game at The Den on the first Saturday of December of last year.

The "Lions" cannot claim an entirely successful season this term for they have failed at home on no fewer than four occasions, their conquerors being, Aldershot by two goals to one, Cardiff City by four goals to two, Reading by one goal to nil and Southend United by two goals to one, whilst Bristol City, Coventry City, Exeter City, Newport County, Torquay United, Watford and ourselves have come away from the Den with one point. However, to counterbalance this deficiency somewhat the "Lions" have succeeded at Bournemouth by two goals to one, at Northampton by four goals to two, at Queens Park Rangers by three goals to two, at Torquay by three goals to one and at Gillingham by a similar score, whilst a share of the spoils has been gained at Aldershot and Notts County. It will thus be seen that this season Millwall are a team of surprises, always accomplishing the unexpected, so we must look to our laurels if we wish to defeat them today.

Millwall only retained thirteen of their last season's players and newcomers to their ranks include, Reginald Dudley and Edward Smith, full backs from Apsley Town and Barking Town respectively, Thomas Brolly a half back from Sheffield Wednesday and in the vanguard Owen McCahill from Fulham, Fred Jones and Hugh Blair from Swansea Town, Hugh O'Grady from Bury, James Payne from Brighton and James Smith from Hitchin Town.

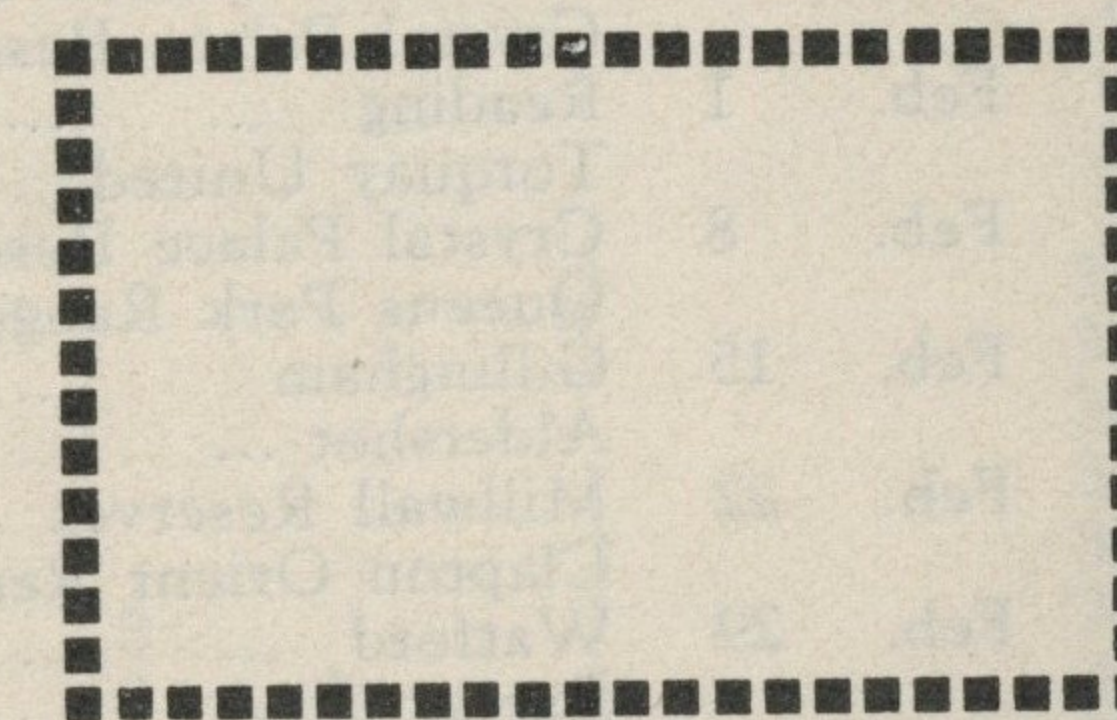
IMPORTANT

POSERS for SPORTSMEN

1. What ranks as the record in the history of the F.A. Cup for the highest number of victories achieved in one round by teams playing against higher grade clubs?

2. How often has it happened in the whole history of the Football League that a team has finished a season with a record of precisely a point per game and also a perfectly balanced goal average?

3. A club in the Second Division formerly gave trials to eight players now in professional services of First Division members, but neither offered any of them professional terms nor included them in their league side. What were the circumstances?

Here are the Answers

1. That created in the first round on January 11th 1908, when nine ties were won by teams of lower League Status than their victims. Four Southern League teams in Brighton, New Brompton, Norwich

City and Swindon Town beat First Division sides in Preston, Sunderland, Sheffield Wednesday and Sheffield United respectively, two Southern League members, Plymouth Argyle and Southampton, beat Second Division opposition in Barnsley and Burnley respectively, and three Second Division clubs in Grimsby, Hull City and Leicester Fosse beat First Division rivals in Bristol City, Woolwich Arsenal and Blackburn Rovers respectively.

2. Only three. In the First Division, Birmingham had 38 points from 38 games and a 52-52 goal record in 1907-6, and Bradford City 38 points for 38 matches and a 40-40 goal average in 1913-14, and in the Second Division, Southampton had 42 points for 42 contests and a goal return of 40-40 in 1922-23.

3. Newcastle United gave trials in their Reserve team to:— Matthew Middleton and Leonard Dunn (Sunderland), John Tennant (Bolton Wanderers), Raymond Parkin (Middlesbrough), Norman Christie (Blackburn Rovers), Alfred Fenwick (Sheffield Wednesday), Robert Liddle (Stoke City) and Septimus Rutherford (Portsmouth) and allowed all of them to depart.

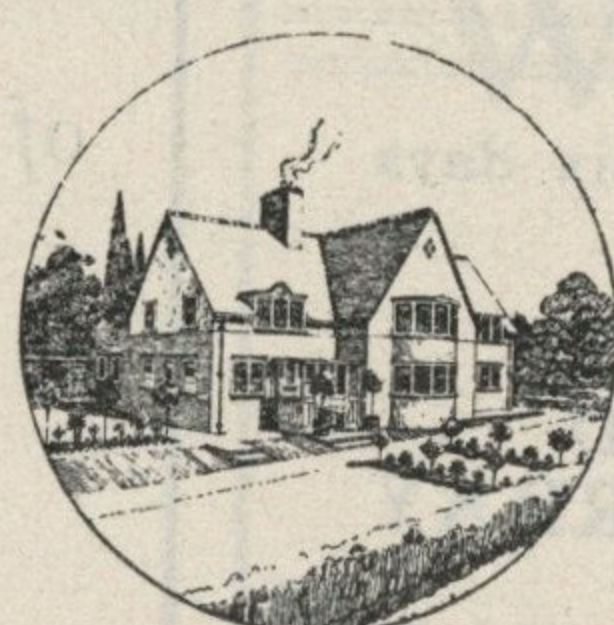

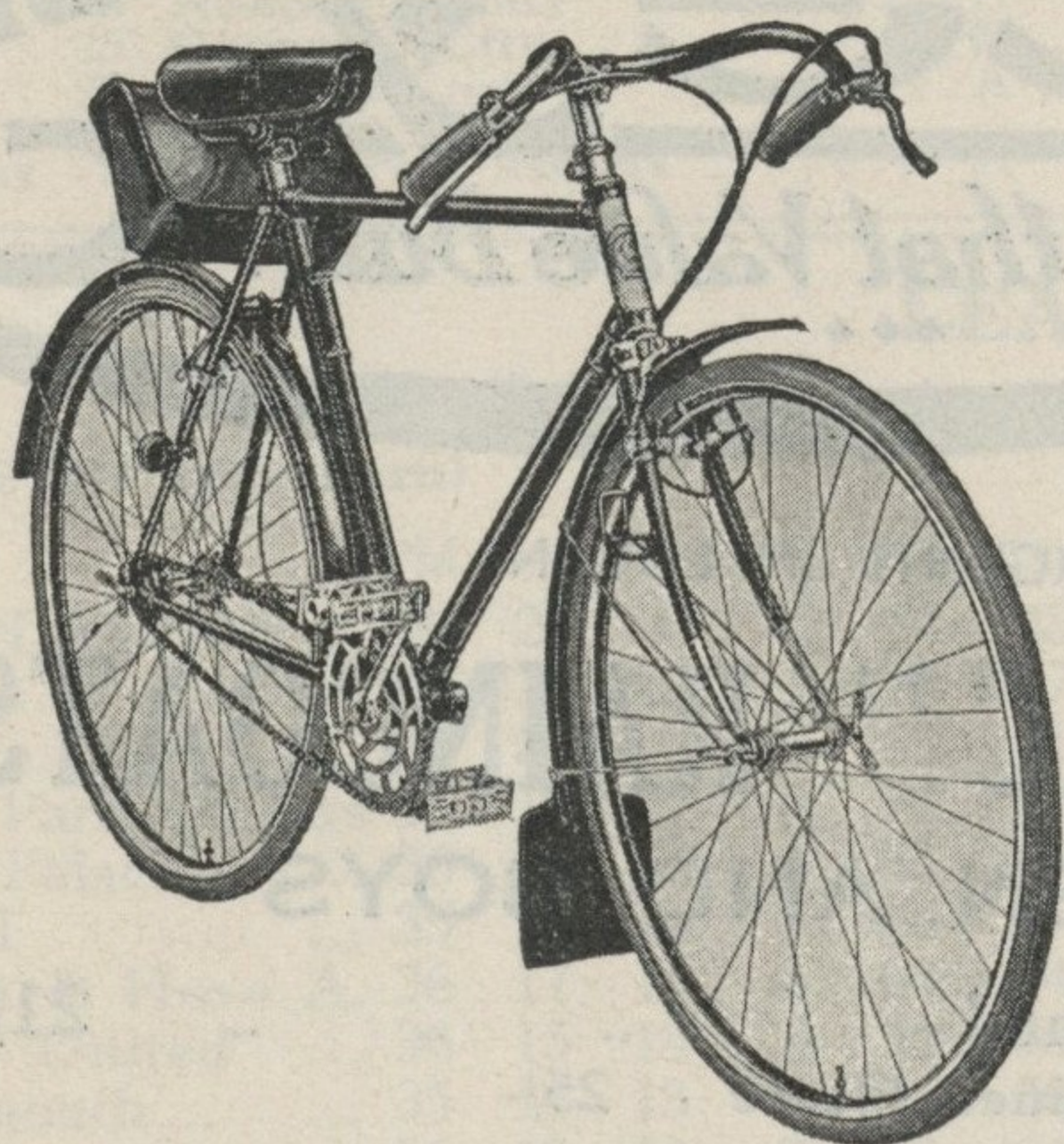
