



TUSSELS between our visitors this afternoon, Crystal Palace, and ourselves have always been of an interesting nature, and the results that have ensued have been more or less of an even nature. Season after season the "Glaziers" maintain a high position in the League Table, yet fail to make a really effective bid for promotion. Last season they occupied the sixth rung, their home record being exceptionally good. But their "away" match figures—seven wins, thirteen losses and only one draw—rather indicates their lack of consistency.

It appears as though again this season they have struck this indifferent form for after creating a drawn game of one goal each with Clapton Orient at the Lea Bridge Road ground, they fail unaccountably at home to Notts County by the odd goal in three, only to turn the tables on the "Magpies" in the return game at Nottingham, on Monday evening last, when they were successful by the only goal of the match. Sandwiched between their two games with the County was a home match with Walsall, our last opponents, against whom they were successful by three goals to one. Thus it will be seen that their last two games have been two victories, and also that they have yet to be defeated on foreign soil.

Of last season's team the "Glaziers" retained no fewer than seventeen players, and to their ranks have been added Knox and Briggs, custodians, respectively from Notts County and Fulham, two new half backs in Telling and Walker, ex-Reading

and Notts County, whilst the vanguard has been strengthened by the acquisition of Liddle from Reading, McMenemy from Northampton and Watson from Coventry City.


Last season we gained a handsome victory over the "Glaziers" at Luton, winning by six goals to nil, although the Palace repaid the compliment when we visited Selhurst Park, scoring five goals to our one.

## CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

We were all disappointed when the final score reached us from Cardiff on Saturday last to the effect that we had lost by three clear goals. Perhaps some of us expect too much, that is the trouble when a team has been successful, especially when one considers the fine away record we have had of late. Therefore the fact that our defence had conceded three goals was an unpleasant shock, and reasons were sought for. Our first thought before having any report on the game, was that someone must have been injured, but when it was known that three goals had been scored before Tom Smith was forced to take the outside left position, we had to look for some other excuse. But no excuse is needed, the long and short of it was our three half backs had a bad day and Cardiff had the fortune that was going, even during the last half hour of the game when our lads were practically shooting for goal. The City goal during this period had a charmed life and with the slightest piece of luck we should have squared matters or even had our nose in front. But it was not to be, we lost, as I daresay we shall lose some more matches before the season has concluded.

We had a different tale to sing about on Monday evening. Our boys were in sparkling form and but for the brilliance of Leckie the "Saddlers" custodian there is no doubt we shall have had a hatful of goals. During the opening half shots rained on him from all directions but he effected miraculous saves and fully earned the fine ovation he was given. Jack Ball was given the centre forward berth and Joe Payne was tried at inside right vice Mills and Martin, and doubtless the change was for the good. Joe's exhibition at inside right was an eye opener for he combined very effectively with Hodge and the right wing proved to be the most dangerous on view. Jack Hodge was great, there is no other word for it, for he was always the master of his opponent. In spite of this improved display however, the interval arrived without any score. The second half was a repetition of the first, Leckie still rising brilliantly to the occasion and it appeared as if we should never get one past him. Mid-way through the half Jack Ball and Joe Payne changed places and the move was immediately successful. Bill Fellowes centred the ball which Joe deflected with his head to the feet of Jack Ball and the latter made no mistake. The bombardment of the Walsall goal was continued but further success did not befall us until ten minutes from the end when Joe Payne scored from the penalty spot. The defence had an easy evening and were never seriously troubled, whilst the halves were an improvement on Saturday's game although still below the form we know they can produce. The forwards were very good and, although only two goals were obtained, gave greater confidence than in any match this season.

The "Stiffs" game with Portsmouth, the Combination champions, on Saturday produced a ding dong struggle, and eventually ended all square, each team scoring once—a very fair result. It was soon obvious why Pompey are the champions of the League for their combination was brilliant and their forwards always take the shortest route for goal. Our boys however played determinedly and were the first to score. After a goalless first half Ron

Stevens headed into the net taking advantage of a hesitancy between Strong and Grundy, but Pompey were soon on level terms, indifferent play by our defence ending in Crawshaw netting.

On Wednesday the "Stiffs" completed their games with Southend and again forced a drawn game of one goal each. They were decidedly unfortunate in not returning with both points for there was never any doubt about the genuineness of Frank Sloan's goal, and it is a matter of amazement how the referee gave him offside. Wilf Crompton received a cross pass from Hugh Boyd and, after controlling the ball and taking it practically to the touch line, put across a low centre which beat all the Southend defence and Frank Sloan running up, tapped the ball in the net.

Today we entertain Crystal Palace, a team that have yet to lose away from home. On Monday last, whilst we were beating Walsall, the "Glaziers" were defeating Notts County on the Meadow Lane Ground, thus avenging their home defeat of the week previous. The "Glaziers" have a very good side this term and appear right on top of their form at the moment so our boys will have all their work cut out to maintain their home record. The team selected is the same as on Monday last.

The "Stiffs" have a hard game at Charlton, for the "Valley" men are hot stuff this year and have yet to lose a match. If they can bring back any spoils they will have accomplished something exceedingly good. The team selected is Coen, Booton, Hubbard, Godfrey, McGinnigle, Kidd, Rich, Lutterloch, Patrich, Mills and Stevens.

Immediately at the conclusion of the game this afternoon, Alderman Harry Arnold, J.P., C.A., will present to Joe Payne the ball with which Joe accomplished his record scoring performance against Bristol Rovers on Easter Monday.


