A Weekly Commentary.

Although we lost the last two games at Walsall and Reading, respectively, it was not because the team played badly, but luck seemed against the City. At Walsall they were very unfortunate to lose Chesters for 20 minutes in the first half during which time Walsall scored twice. Although the City scored the only goal in the second half they were unable to get on level terms and were beaten by 4 goals to 2. At Reading last Wednesday the City held their own until about 5 minutes from time when Reading scored the only goal of the match, although a good many of the spectators asserted that the Reading player who passed the ball to the scorer was in an offside position when he received the ball. The Reading supporters were much impressed by the City's determination, who, although beaten, were not disgraced, and not many visiting teams will take points away from Elm Park.

Today's match against Luton Town should prove a very attractive game, as the visitors are a very difficult side to beat and will be all out to improve their high position in the League. The City will have to be on their best behaviour to win, and an exciting game is promised.

Next Saturday the City are at Cardiff who have rekindled a lot of the old enthusiasm by gaining 10 points out of a possible 12. Cardiff had a gate of over 30,000 at their last home match which goes to prove that a winning team will always draw a big crowd. The City and Cardiff are keen rivals and a thrilling encounter is promised.

The next two matches at St. James' Park on the 26th and 30th September are in connection with the Exeter and District League, and it is to be hoped that there will be good crowds to give the amateurs every encouragement.
