

WE welcome today, our friends and rivals from the Biscuit Town, Reading, and from the results between us in the past seasons we should witness another rousing tussle.

Reading have for some seasons been knocking at the door of the Second Division and this time folks in the Biscuit town anticipate they might at last capture the prize, owing to the strengthening of certain positions. The team however, have not made a too auspicious start. At home, although they succeeded in trouncing Notts County, they only gained narrow victories over Bristol City and Exeter City. The latter they only beat by a single goal, which might be deemed a poor comparison with our win at Exeter on Saturday last. But do not let us deal in comparisons for we can arrive at some extraordinary conclusions where football is concerned. Last Saturday, Reading proved to be the bane of the football forecasters by losing at home to Walsall. This by the way was the first meeting between the two clubs, for when Walsall were last in the Southern Section, Reading were battling in a higher sphere.

So far this season, the Biscuiters have relied mainly on last year's players, only

three of their new men having figured in the first eleven. These are Allen, Watkin and Kirkman. Allen was previously with Charlton Athletic, for whom he was a prolific goalscorer and played a great part in carrying them out of Third Division football. To enable him to lead the attack, Tom Tait, Reading's most consistent scorer in the past two years has been tried at inside right. Tom may not be in the team today, as he incurred a leg injury last Saturday. Watkin appears to be Reading's best capture and our defenders will have to watch this player carefully. He previously had experience with Aston Villa, and most of Reading's goals so far this season have been initiated by him. Reading also seem to have a fondness for Bolton Wanderers' players, for both Kirkman and Wright, who have shared the left half position, both come from there. Included in the full back position might also be Reid, an Irish International, unless Robson who was injured last week, has sufficiently recovered. Albert Hayhurst, who is well known in Luton, has been appointed the "Biscuiters" captain this term and he has the reputation of being a great stopper.

If Reading find their proper form today, it should be a great game.

PARS and POSTSCRIPTS

The player in question, Leslie Miller, an outside left who has been with Sochaux F.C. for six years, learnt his football in the London Business Houses League.

Against Sheffield Wednesday, Everton paraded an all International attack which represented three nations. On the right there were Gillick and Miller, Scots, Dean in the centre and the Irish pair, Stevenson and Coulter, on the left.


