CLUB CHATTER.

We extend hearty congratulations to the boys for a nice "double" on Saturday last. A 3—0 victory over the Reserves of Clapton was in keeping with a timely 4—2 win at Walsall.

At Walsall we showed sufficiently good form to deserve our points in spite of what you may have read to the contrary. After their fine result at Reading the previous Saturday when they gained a surprse 3—0 victory it looked as if we would have something stern to oppose and in that we weren't disappointed because they opened as they must have left off in the Biscuit Town. Our rearguard was giving nothing away however and we had gradually stemmed the tide when "*Cheet*," who had opened on a high tone, went through from the centre circle to score one of his inimitable goals. Judging to a nicety the flight of a long return from our goal area, he trapped in his stride as his policeman misjudged the air ball and he was off in full cry, pursued by three converging defenders and confronted by the advancing 'keeper, and just before the inevitable collision occurred he slipped the ball into the corner of the net. Unfortunately the thrill was lost on a home crowd, although they were not slow to show appreciation to a craftsman.

Just before the half-time whistle—a half-minute in fact—they equalised from a corner-kick.

Fellows Park lies on a distinct slope, it drops six feet from goal to goal, and they, judging from the roars of encouragement set up immediately on resuming downhill, evidently are accustomed to find reward for persistent and mighty boots into the opponents' danger zone. These tactics soon produced a very doubtful goal—an offside decision would have been more in keeping with the Rule book—but within three minutes *Jim Allan* earned distinction with a splendid drive from the "box" line following a long throw-in from the left.

Jim pulled this one "out of the bag" at a most opportune moment for it proved the death-knell for the 'sall. We were now working the ball in our own time and *Harry Lowe* soon set our barometer fair with one of his deceptive cross-shots that was helped into the net by a defending cranium. Then, some ten minutes from the end, "*Cheet*" set our mercury bubbling when he finished off a fine piece of close passing on the left flank—a side-foot lob over the head of the advancing 'keeper.

Against the Orient Reserves a none-too-inspiring game ultimately ran in our favour after a goalless first period. Reg. Banks paved the way to victory when he opened our account. Bill Royan followed with his weekly contribution before our total was made three by a defender.


