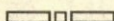

THIS afternoon we are visited by our neighbours from Watford, and what a match this has every indication of being. Excitement and tensy has reigned supreme during this week not only here in Luton but also in the Hertfordshire town and it is more than possible that today's invasion of Luton will see about the largest body of supporters that ever accompanied the "Wasps" on an away fixture.

We here in Luton realise that the Watford team commands respect, their away record amply verifying this, and so it should be more than the usual thrilling game that we should witness this afternoon. Let us hope therefore that we shall witness a clean stirring struggle and that the better team takes the spoils.

Our opponents have a particularly strong side out today, so perhaps a few remarks concerning each player would not be out of place.

J. McLaren, is the ex-Leicester City goalkeeper and is now in his fourth season at Vicarage Road. He is noted for his physique and fearlessness as well as his daring dashes from goal.

R. V. O'Brien, the right back, is the "Wasps" former inside left whom Manager McBain made a full back to fill an emergency. There he has remained a brilliant defender, particularly in the use he makes of the ball.

A. Woodward, is another "convert" having made his name as a half back. Has 100% conscientiousness, but still settling down in his new berth. In his 11th season.

E. Morgan, was a player who sprung into the limelight last season. Is a capture from Welsh junior football with a touch of class.

J. H. Armstrong, was formerly with Queens Park Rangers and needs little introduction. He is an experienced pivot who uses his head to save his feet and is on the top of his form just now.

A. Reed, a 6ft. 1in. left half is a hard worker, though somewhat out of place on the flank. His former club was Charlton.

W. Davies, the right winger has a fine turn of speed together with ball control and finishing ability. Manager McBain snapped him up at the age of 17 and is proud of his progress during his five years stay at Watford.

Tom Barnett was top scorer last season and makes Davies an ideal partner, though he is inclined to be put off his game by vigorous opposition. He has just had a benefit. Came to Watford via Manchester United eight seasons ago on Frank Barson's recommendation.

T. C. Walters, formerly of Torquay, is improving rapidly. He is heavily built and a great trier, though not noted as yet as a marksman.

W. Devan is an inside left with Scottish and Irish experience. He is a clever all-round player, who draws the opposition and also directs his shots well. At the moment he is not hitting the high spots but scored 15 goals last term.

A. Hurst was signed from Exeter in August and is at present, the most dangerous marksman in the side, rarely missing the net given half a chance to score. He was injured after getting the match winner at Northampton last Saturday, and should he be unable to turn out today, H. F. Tinklin, formerly of Aldershot, Folkestone and various Midland Clubs, may deputise.

## CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

We had another good match last Saturday, at any rate we thought it good, although Bristol City might manufacture another adjective to describe it. The team as a whole played excellently so that criticisms are not required although comparisons can be made. Tom Mackey has played better games and I thought he gave Dryden too much rope especially as the winger was a speed merchant. Perhaps this was so noticeable because Tom rarely does leave his winger unattended. Jack Nelson too caused me some anxious moments. Not when the ball was in the air, that is always a foregone conclusion, but when he gets the ball on the ground. This dribbling habit is a bad 'un and makes my poor old heart go pit pat. However as I said just previously these are comparisons and not criticisms. The wing half backs gave a brilliant display and the Roberts-Stephenson wing had one of their old times. For once in a way Joe Payne did not score, but with the extra watch he was given, Jack Ball had more license with the result that Jack's goals for increased by two. It was also pleasing to note Jack Hodge's initial appearance in the goal scoring list. I have always wondered when Jack would open his account and must confess to be rather amazed that it should not have happened long before the tenth game. To my mind he appears a winger who could and should get a bagful of goals. His successful effort on Saturday was a gem, taken coolly and with the skill of a veteran. Now that we have had our appetites whetted we shall be like Oliver Twist—ask for more.

The game commenced with a bombardment on the City goal which was kept up practically throughout the game, but it was not until the seventeenth minute that George Stephenson opened our account, although many spectators, I among them, thought that his pile driver a few minutes earlier had crossed the goal line after hitting the inside of the post. After this first success the City defenders played stubbornly, kicking the ball first time irrespective of direction, with the result that the interval arrived without any further addition to the score. I thought however Joe Payne's offside goal was quite a legitimate point, although my neighbour agreed with the referee's decision. The commencement of the second half was a repetition of the first, but quickly our attacks met with success, Jack Ball netting twice in the first seven minutes. With a three goals lead our defence seemed to ease up with the result that the City came into the picture. On one or two occasions it seemed that through dallying their clearances the defence would allow the visitors to score, but thanks to Dolman,

who made several good saves, and also the inability of the City forwards to shoot straight, our goal remained intact. As if aware of their mistaken policy, as the game drew to a close their original tactics were employed and five minutes from the end Jack Hodge scored No. 4.

The "Stiffs" journeyed to Bristol and engaged the City Reserves, a draw of one goal each resulting. This was a very creditable performance especially as Harold Booton was injured in the first quarter of an hour and had to finish the game at outside right, Lutterloch taking the back position with Beresford in the intermediate line. It was Frank Beresford too, who scored the goal (prior to the re-arrangement of the team) rounding off a capital movement with a good shot. The hero of the game however was Reg Kingham, who took charge of the citadel. Joe Coen sprained his wrist against the Palace Reserves on the Wednesday previous, but the injury was not deemed too serious and expectations of his fitness seemed assured. Unfortunately the injury did not respond to treatment as quickly as was expected and later on the Friday afternoon it was decided not to play him. A hunt around was made immediately for a successor but none were available and accordingly Reg was pressed into service. He rose, as I expected him, to the occasion and earned the ovation he received when he left the field.

Today is the day of days and our old rivals from Watford provide the opposition. What a game it should prove to be for our Hertfordshire opponents are going great guns this term, especially on foreign soil. I say it in all sincerity that I think Watford, together with Millwall, will be our most serious contenders for the championship. Only time alone will prove this.

Providing the necessary sanction is obtained from the Football League a very attractive game has been arranged for **Hughie McGinnigle's Benefit**. The Scottish Central League, the Competition which is very eagerly combed by the leading English Clubs, has promised to send their best Representative Team to Luton on Saturday, 28th November to play us. This should prove to be a very attractive fixture and should especially appeal to the large number of Scotsmen now resident in Luton. No player has so conscientiously served the Club as has Hughie, so I appeal to you all to turn up in large numbers and give him his deserts. If there should be anyone who finds himself or herself unable to be present that day, their contribution will be welcomed by the Club who will see that it all goes to swell the fund. **Please therefore bear this date in mind. 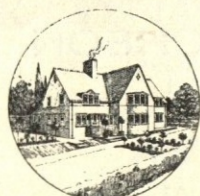

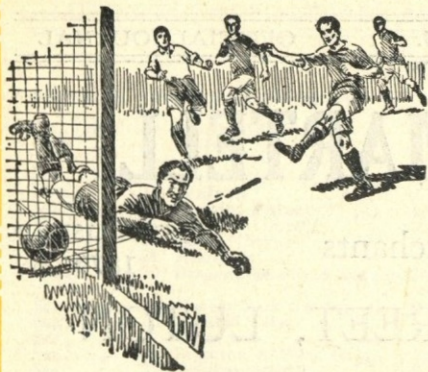
