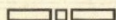

TODAY we receive Bournemouth and Boscombe Athletic and extend to them a hearty welcome on their visit to Luton. This is the second time this season we have had Bournemouth as our opponents, the previous occasion being on September 30th last in the First Round of the Southern Section Cup when we were successful by three goals to one.

Although at that time they were doing very successfully in the League table, they have since improved this position, home victories of one goal to nil over Notts County and Brighton and Hove Albion and on Saturday last by three goals to two against Walsall, rising them to second position, where they stand on equal points to ourselves and with only a slightly inferior goal average. Bournemouth have not dropped a point on their ground at Dean Court, and as we too are in a similar position here, this unique state of affairs should make today's game all the more interesting, and a hard fought and exciting match should result.

Their team today differs in only three positions from that in September last. Mellors is preferred to Gold between the sticks and Bellis takes the place of Marsden at left full back, whilst in the vanguard, Kilcar their recent capture from Burnley makes way for Whittam at inside right.

CLUB NOTES by "Hatter"

So our visit to Brighton last Saturday did not prove as profitable as last year. It was distinctly unfortunate for a win would have placed us in a very enviable position as far as the League Table was concerned, what with Cardiff losing to Watford, Swindon losing to Bristol City, Millwall only drawing with Torquay, whilst Bournemouth's goal average was lowered by Walsall, the "Seasiders" ultimately being successful by the odd goal in five. However, although unfortunate, we must admit it makes the position more interesting, for it leaves a number of Clubs round the top of the table with only a couple of points separating them. Our visitors today are our nearest rivals, occupying the second rung, and we can look forward to an interesting game. I am quite aware we have already beaten Bournemouth once this season in the first round of the Southern Section Cup, and through this, in some quarters, the result of the match is considered a foregone conclusion. Now don't believe it, nothing is certain in football, and remember also our other mating with Bournemouth was in a Southern Section Cup Match, not a League III venture.

As far as the game at Brighton was concerned it was not a too happy an affair. The Brighton players got stuck in (not unfairly) and our boys seemed to be put off their game. This has been a very noticeable trait in our away games and we have suffered accordingly. We do not seem to show that extra amount of "devil" away from home as we do on our own enclosure. Then again we always seem to start so lackadaisically with the result that more often than not we find ourselves at least a goal down in the first quarter of an hour, and have to go all out in an endeavour to pull the game out of the fire. Yes, I am afraid we have got to show much better form on foreign soil if we are to be the ultimate champions of the Division.

The "Stiffs" added another two points to their total at the expense of Southampton Reserves, winning by three goals to one. But here again one can criticise the display, for on the resultant play the score should have been near double figures. If the inside forwards will persist in hanging back, goals never will come, and although I quite agree that the "Stiffs" have a certain amount of excuse as regards last Saturday, their displays are not a quarter as convincing as they were during last season. Now I wish to make an appeal to the supporters. In their exuberance as a goal was scored, during the match with Watford, someone threw a lighted firework onto the field. Whilst the Directors have no wish whatsoever to stay

enthusiasm on the part of supporters, they have decided that this firework business must cease. The reason is obvious. Visiting clubs and officials have a right to protest against such action, and the Directors do not wish the ground to come under the ban of the Football Association. They earnestly appeal to all supporters to assist them in this matter and so prevent a recurrence.

So another of our Directors, Mr. Horace Hewson is attempting to seek election to the Luton Town Council at the forthcoming Elections in November. He is standing as the People's Candidate for the Stopsley Ward, and I am sure he will be pleased to receive any votes from our supporters in the Stopsley area on November 2nd next. Mr. Hewson has been a Director of the Club now for quite a number of years and is a very energetic worker, especially in travelling on scouting expeditions in the search for new players, and he is also exceedingly popular with the players and staff. If he succeeds in his attempt, as we all hope he will, there still remain a further five directors whom we can put on the Town Council.

Just one last word. Don't forget Hughie McGinnigle's Benefit Match, on Saturday, November 28th next, when the Scottish Central League are sending a representative side to meet us.

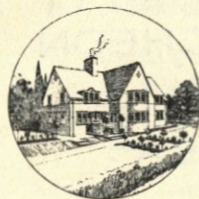
