NOTES ON TO-DAY'S TEAMS

Back to League games again and, we hope with all efforts being made to improve the County's position in the table. Once again the club's stay in the Cup Competition has been a short one, but, at any rate, they have progressed one round further than usual.

Heading the Third Division with 25 points in 17 games—a game less than the number played by their nearest challengers—Luton have a fine record, and this has been secured with a team made up exclusively of players who have played together for more than a season. There are no newcomers in their side.

They play an attacking game and include two centre-forwards in their side—Ball leading the line and Payne—(the record-breaker) at inside right. The Luton team have averaged more than two goals a game this season. and Ned Liddell, their new manager, is in high spirits as to the prospects of Second Division football next season. There is no doubt that their record of late years deserves such an honour.

Usually our lads play better against prospective champions than others at Somerton Park. We make changes of necessity, but they appear to be to the good. At any rate, we are assured that every one of our lads will do his utmost to lower the colours of the prospective champions in a sporting and keen game.
