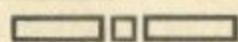

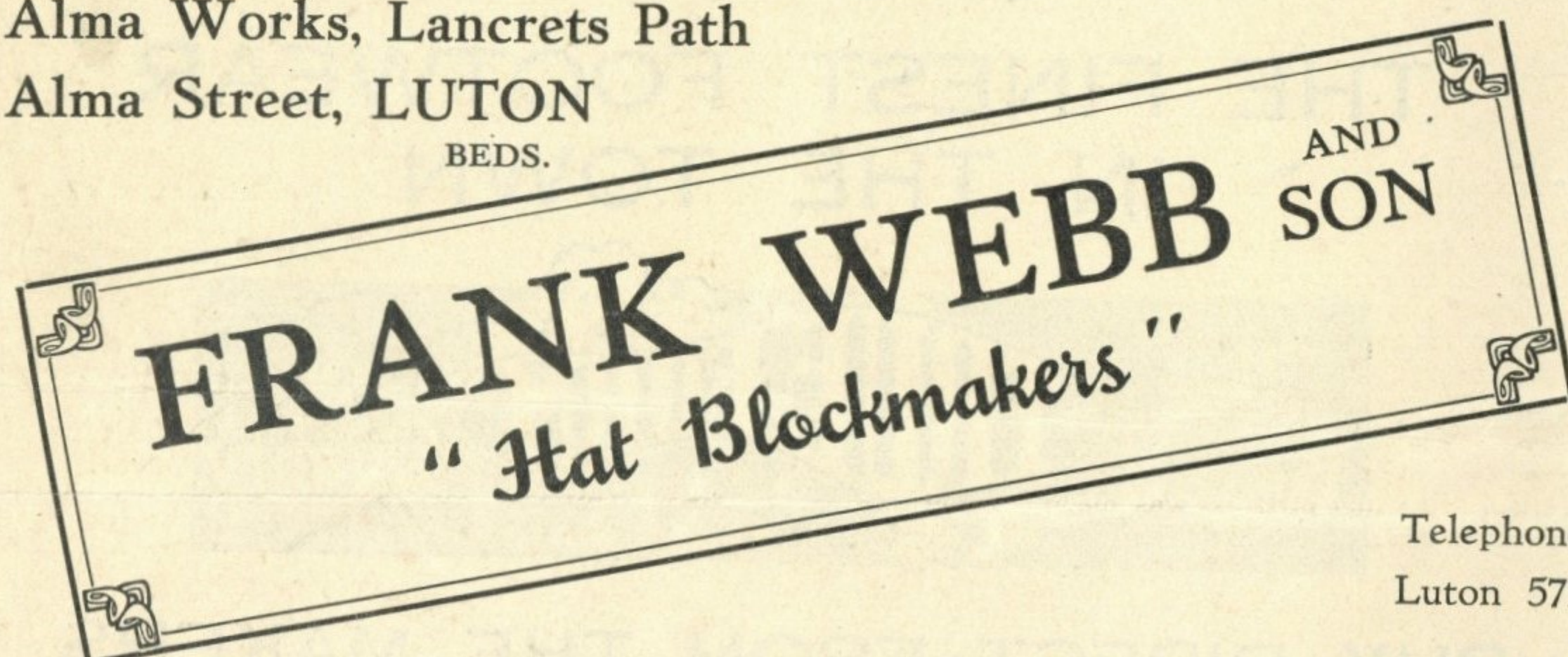

WE extend a very hearty welcome to our Cup Tie opponents, Blackpool, on their visit here today, and trust that whatever the result of the game this afternoon may prove to be, they will carry away with them nothing but the most pleasant of memories of their journey to "Hatopolis." The Lancashire Club arrives with great performances accomplished this season and at the present time head the Second Division Table. They seem to specialise in away victories and this, coupled with the fact that we flourish on home wins, heralds today's game as one of the best, if not the best, tie of the round. Whilst we sincerely hope that our boys will pull through, none will congratulate Blackpool more heartily than ourselves if they are able to lower our colours. May the best team win.

The Blackpool Football Club was founded on July 26th, 1887. It was created by members of the St. John's Team, and the sole objects of the enthusiasts who aimed for this project was simply that there should be a town's club bearing the town's name. At first it was proposed to alter the name of the existing club, but eventually it was unanimously decided "That a club be formed to be known as the Blackpool Football Club."

The opening match of this new club was against Chorley and they suffered defeat by two goals to one, but a different story was the result of their first home game with Leek, and from thence onwards distinct progress was made. Membership of the Lancashire League was obtained in 1890, and four years later the championship of the competition was gained. In 1896 they were elected to the Second Division of the Football League, but returned to the Lancashire League for the 1899-1900 season. Then came the amalgamation with the South Shore Football Club on December 12th, 1899, and also a renewal of the relationships with the Football League clubs. A third application had to be made

in 1909, for the club finished at the bottom of the poll and re-election had to be sought. Little progress was made until 1911, when Blackpool finished seventh in the table, but in the post war days they have become a much stronger element winning promotion to the First Division in the 1929-30 season, only to be relegated in 1933.

Blackpool Football Club was formed into a Limited Liability Company in 1896 with a capital of £2,000 divided into one pound shares. The first balance sheet showed a loss of £1,182 and an item of interest in the accounts was transfer fees received £115-19-9, but how the odd figure was reached is not known. The club has been financially embarrassed on many occasions, but loyal support has always been forthcoming, and many improvements have been made to the ground including a grand stand which was completed for the commencement of the 1925-6 season.

The ground capacity is about 32,000 and famous players who have been on the club books include J. Hampson, H. P. Hardman, J. F. Mitchell, G. Wilson, H. Bedford, J. Lane and P. Quinn.

A few Pen Pictures of the Blackpool Players

Jock Wallace. The Scottish goalkeeper who has been out of action since the beginning of December, when a serious accident in a match at Plymouth confined him to a hospital ward for three weeks. Was signed from Raith Rovers in February, 1934, introduced immediately into the Second Division. Late last year he played his 100th League game for Blackpool. A daring guardian of his goal who may yet play for Scotland. 6ft. 12st. 7lb.

Alec Roxburgh. One of the few men in the Blackpool team who graduated in the Blackpool area. Has been understudy to a succession of Second Division goalkeepers for four years. Was an automatic selection when Jock Wallace was crippled at the beginning of last month, and played in six of the sequence of nine games which Blackpool won recently to create a League record for the season. Entered football as a forward and converted himself into a goalkeeper. 6ft. 1in. 11st. 2lbs.

Daniel Blair. One of the three Scottish Internationals signed by Blackpool during the summer. Aston Villa paid a £7,000 fee for his services when he was transferred from Clyde. Played football in Scotland, England, Ireland, Canada and the United States. Has never missed a game for Blackpool since he left the Villa during the summer. The smallest full-back in first-class football. 5 ft. 5 in. 10 st. 6 lbs.

Richard Witham. A young left back who tired of deputising for Roy Goodall at Huddersfield. Such a capable deputy for the international that Blackpool had to pay a four figure fee for him when he was transferred from Huddersfield in February 1934, a couple of days after the signing of Jock Wallace. Has never since, except when on the casualty list, been out of Second Division football. A composed, stylish full back. 5 ft. 11 ins. 12 st. 1 lb.

George Farrow. Another of Blackpool's close season acquisitions. The only man in the Blackpool team conversant with Southern Section football. Made his name at Bournemouth last season. In his first game at Blackpool—it was for the second team—he scored a hat-trick as an inside forward, but it is as a right half that he has established himself in the Second Division. Never missed a penalty for Blackpool. A strong attacking wing half with a scoring shot. 5 ft. 10 ins. 12 st. 9 lb.

Louis Cardwell. The one Blackpool born player in the Lancashire club's team. Was on the staff three years before he was given his chance in the Second Division in November, 1934. Has never since been absent, and a week ago made his 100th successive League appearance. Ranks today as one of the the best defensive centre half backs in the land. Centre forwards seldom score against Blackpool these days. 5 ft. 11 ins. 12 st. 2 lbs.

Sam Jones. A wing half who was unexpectedly acquired by Blackpool immediately after he had played his first game for Ireland in the autumn of 1933. His brother is "Soldier" Jones, the Irish international centre half. Has played over 100 games for Blackpool in the Second Division, and at Plymouth last month, after Jock Wallace had been removed to hospital, was the principal in a sensational game, wearing the goalkeeper's jersey and playing with distinction in his unfamiliar position for 80 of the 90 minutes. 5 ft. 10 ins. 11 st. 6 lbs.

James Hall. Came to Blackpool from Bath City and for months played in the second team. Unexpectedly his chance in the Second Division presented itself during the Christmas games. Surprised everybody by the great football he played, revealing himself as a half back whose long passes created forward raids. It is his first Cup Tie for a big League club. 5 ft. 8½ ins. 10 st.

Richard Watmough. Another four figure transfer player. Made a name with Bradford City before his transfer to Blackpool in September, 1934. A fast direct wing raider with a scoring

shot. Has been twice on the casualty list this season—his last game was in the rout of Leicester City on Boxing Day but already has nine goals credited to him in Blackpool's scoring list. An elusive forward who has a punch. 5 ft. 4 ins. 10 st. 10 lbs.

James Hampson. The international centre forward who has become an inside right in the international class. Blackpool's long service forward. Was signed from Nelson in October, 1927 and since has established new scoring records for the Lancashire club. His total of League goals alone in Blackpool's service is 240, and 13 of them he has scored this season. Once he was the sharpshooter of Blackpool's front line—his 45 goals in the promotion season of 1929-30 created one of his records—and now is the general. 5 ft. 6½ ins. 11 st.

Robert Finan. The Scot from Yoker, who, after playing for two years as an inside forward, was converted by Mr. Joe Smith, the Blackpool manager, into Jimmy Hampson's successor. The move was such a success that the new leader scored 34 Second Division goals last season, missing the Division championship by only one goal, and is out after the title again with a total of 20. An offer of £7,000 was recently refused for him. One of the fastest men on Blackpool's staff. 5 ft. 6½ in. 10 st. 8 lb.

T. W. Jones. The inside forward signed from Burnley in September 1933. A 90 minutes a match man. Recently hit the head-lines when he scored four goals in one half against Nottingham Forest, and has often since been in the marksmen's list. Had the reputation when he went to Blackpool of being the best inside forward in the Second Division. Has seldom been out of the Lancashire club's firm team. 5 ft. 8 in. 11 st. 8 lbs.

Frank Hill. The Blackpool captain from the Arsenal. Was signed as a wing-half, but has revealed the versatility which he often displayed when at Highbury. His transfer to the outside-left position, where he has already shot six goals, coincided with the opening of the nine-wins-in-succession march which ended early in the New Year with Blackpool leading the field in the promotion race. 5 ft. 5 in. 11 st. 1 lb.

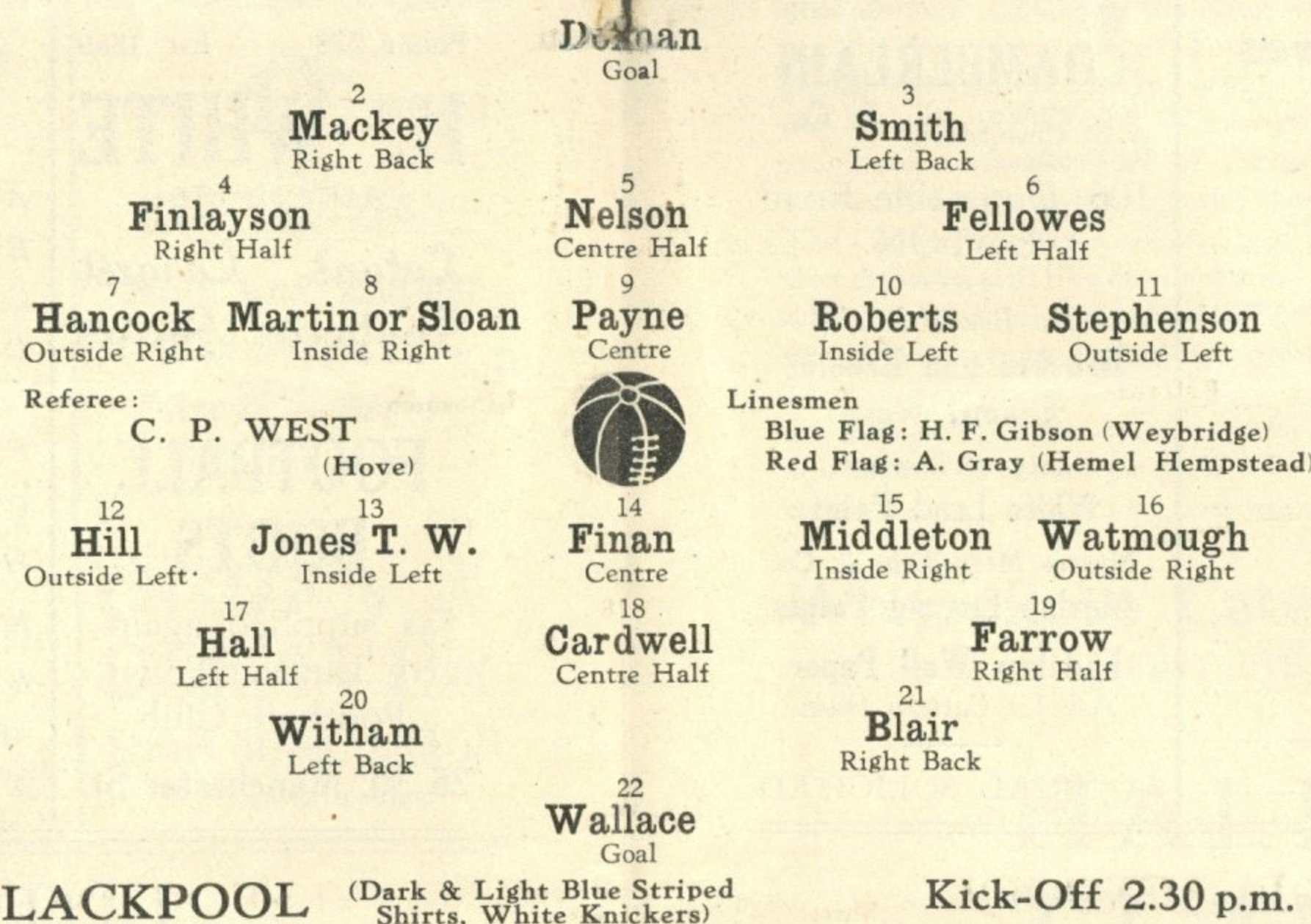

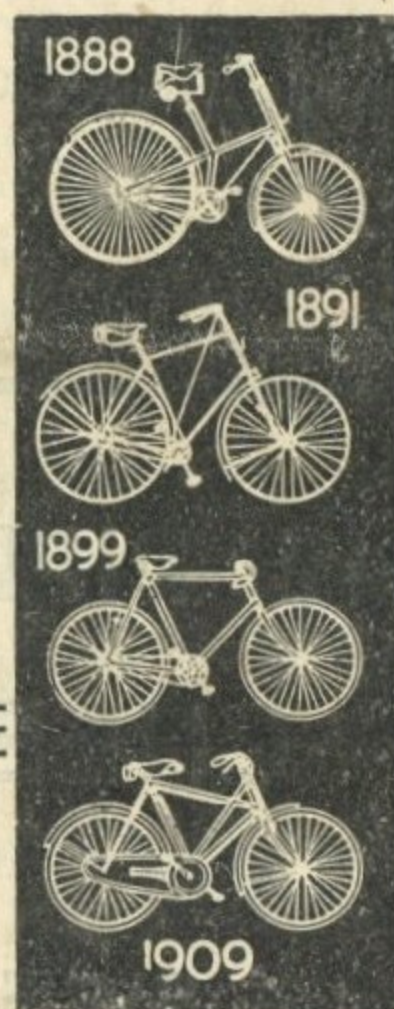
