



WE are proud of the honour that the luck of the Cup Draw has bestowed on us this afternoon, when we entertain the League Champions, Sunderland. They arrive with a great reputation, and there is not the slightest doubt that the game seen here this afternoon will show only too well how this reputation has been accomplished.

Sunderland have every reason to be proud of their record, for few clubs can claim to have leapt into fame with such startling rapidity or have such a time honoured career as the men of Roker Park. The present day rivalry with Newcastle, their near neighbours, goes back to the early days, when a number of schoolmasters banded together and formed the club. Chief among these gentlemen was a Mr. James Allan, who took a great interest in football and other forms of sport, especially if the object was to aid charity.

During the early days football was a novelty, but rapid strides were made and the Durham Football Association was formed, while in 1887, Mr. Robert Thompson, J.P. became President of the Club.

At that time Sunderland's team was composed mainly of Scotsmen and they quickly became the most formidable combination in the County of Durham, their only serious rivals being Middlesbrough and Newcastle West End. Such was the power of this famous Club that in five seasons they only suffered three home defeats, while in the season 1891-2 they became League champions, a position which they again occupied the following season, after establishing the record number of 100 goals in a series of matches while securing a further record of 48 points. Success continued to come their way, and they again finished on top in the 1894-5 campaign. In fact Sunderland have enjoyed pride of place on no less than six occasions. It is worthy of note that Doig, a brilliant Scottish international goalkeeper, did much for his Club, while in 1905 Middlesbrough paid the then record transfer fee of £1000 for Alf Common who had done such sterling service.

It must not be imagined however, that Sunderland had no disasters for in the 1896-7 season, after an extremely bad term, they lost considerable support which caused them to leave their ground at

Newcastle Road. This change led to the present ground at Roker Park, which has since been the venue of so many thrilling battles. It is one of the finest grounds in the country, with a capacity of 65,000

PEN PICTURES of the SUNDERLAND PLAYERS

Mapson, John (goalkeeper)—Born at Birkenhead
Height 5 ft. 11½ in. Weight 12 stones. Age
19 years. Went to Reading at 17 and signed on
Jubilee Day. Transferred to Sunderland,
March 1936.

Gorman, James (right back)—Born at Liverpool.
Height 5 ft. 9 in. Weight 11 st. 6 lb. Age 26.
Signed for Blackburn Rovers in season 1930-31.
Transferred a fortnight ago to Sunderland at a
fee in the region of £7,000.

Hall, Alec (left back)—Born at East Calder, Midlothian. Height 5 ft. 10 in. Weight 11 st. 5 lb. Few clubs have had such a good bargain for £500. That was all this grand back cost Sunderland when they took him from Dunfermline Athletic. Established himself in the first team in last season's campaign. Had early experience with East Calder Swifts.

Thomson (right half)—Born at Glasgow. Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 9 st. 12 lb. Was taken off the doorsteps of the big Scottish clubs. Sunderland signed him as a youngster from Glasgow Pollock. That was in 1930-1, and two seasons later he was in the League side. An engineer by trade, he now "engineers" delightful attacking movements.

Johnston, Robert (centre half)—Born at Falkirk. Was recruited from Alva Albion Rangers, a Scottish Junior Club, in 1930. Although acting mostly as understudy to John McDougall, he has made League appearances in each of his seasons at Roker Park.

McNab, A. (left half)—Born at Glasgow. Height 5 ft. 5½ in. Weight 10 st. 3½ lb. Formerly with Glasgow junior club. He is a talented player and with Gallacher and Connor forms a formidable left flank.

Duns, Leonard (outside right)—Born at Newcastle. Height 5 ft. 9 in. Weight 11 st. 6 lb. Was spotted by Sunderland soon after leaving school, and in October, 1933, when he reached the age of 17 years, they immediately signed him as a professional. Made his first team debut last season.

Carter, Horatio (inside right)—Born at Sunderland. Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 10 st. 7 lb. True example of "local boy makes good" theme. As a schoolboy he won caps against Wales and Scotland. After an unsuccessful trial with Leicester City he was placed on the ground staff at Sunderland and signed as a professional in 1932. In season 1932-3 he became a regular in the first team and in March of that campaign played in an international trial. Has since gained his full cap.

Gurney, Robert (centre forward)—Born at Silks-worth, near Sunderland. Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 11 st. 3 lb. Went to Roker Park on the recommendation of Charlie Buchan, the famous Sunderland, Arsenal and England forward. Has broken one leg during his career, but still plays with the same dash as ever. Has been "capped."

Gallacher, Patrick (inside left)—Born at Bridge of Weir, Renfrew. Height 5 ft. 7½ in. Weight 11 st. 4 lb. Another of the club's discoveries from Scottish junior football. Was signed from a church side, Linwood St. Connel's, and had his League chance in 1929-30 when only 19. Plays either inside right or left and is a Scottish International.

Connor, James (outside left)—Born at Renfrew. Height 5 ft. 8 in. Weight 10 st. 5 lb. Played with Paisley, Carlisle, Glasgow, Perthshire and St. Mirren before joining the Weariders in 1930. Was actually signed twice by Manager Cochrane, who fixed him up while with St. Mirren and later secured him again after he had taken over the Sunderland managership. A very tricky winger, he has several caps.


